JUNE 2017 OTTS MEETING MINUTES

Call to order was at 7:03, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Randy Winn was recognized for his production of the news letter. And what a beautiful job it was. Minutes were corrected to indicate the correct winner of the gold in the Big Raffle in May: That was Jeff Sikorski. Minutes were accepted as corrected.

Treasurers report was given with the ending balance of \$3514.58, with still so much more to go out for the picnic. Efforts to raise funds for the picnic were recognized with participants noted: Bake Sale \$159; Garage Sale and on line netted a whopping \$680.75.

There was a good discussion lead by Byron about the workings of the Picnic and the parking and per car parking fee.

Our educational program this month was a demonstration and explanation of cleaning metallic material by electrolysis by Anthony Wagstaff. Starting equipment needed: non-metallic container, washing soda and water solution, 9v to 12v from phone or other electronics, some kind of clips or clamps, and a carbon core or material containing carbon. The cathode (bubbly side on test) goes to the coin or artifact. There are many websites and U-tube videos to show procedure.
