

## **MEMBERS PAGE**

#### BUILD YOUR OWN ELECTROLIS KIT - By Jim Cornwell

- 1 Glass container i.e.: Mayonnaise Jar
- 1 AC-DC Adapter: Buy at Radio Shack under \$10
- 120V AC input
- 9V DC output
- l Table spoon
- 2 Small alligator clips one to attach to coin and one to attach to spoon.

Split wire out of Adapter and attached an alligator clip to each end. Bend spoon so it hangs over the rim into solution inside jar. Use a solution of water & salt (1Tbs salt) in container. Place one alligator clip to Coin and other to outside spoon end. Put alligator clips into solution BUT do not let wires/clips touch!

Plug Adapter unit into room socket. Clip holding coin should start bubbling. If not, and spoon bubbles 
Unplug – the polarity is wrong. Just reverse the two alligator clips and you should be all set to go.

#### Notes:

The water gets dirty quickly, so you can't see the coin. After a few minutes unplug the adapter and check its condition

– depending on the type metal it can be eaten up somewhat rapidly. Using a soft brass brush, you can help get off some

Corrosion.

#### PRACTICE A FEW TIMES ON A DIRTY -NO VALUE- COIN!!

WARNING: Do not breathe fumes coming out of container – they are toxic.
