Terry Bude was just behind with 80.5 points and Clarence finished third with 78 points. The top three point winners collected silver quarters for their efforts. Receiving consolation silver dimes were Byron Dunn (76 points), Laura Smith (70 points) and Linda Carlson with 60 points.

Byron Dunn also had the oldest find of the day, a 1944 Wheat Penny.

Just search within Facebook for "Oregon Treasure Trails Society" and join the fun.


Clarence
