



The weather was great with blue skies and a high of 84 degrees.... IN Hawaii!!! We here in the NW received a high of 41 and a constant low speed wind. So cold that Brian Lundquist wore pants AND thermals.

Ten club tokens plus the SPECIAL token were placed and ready to be found. Brian Lundquist and Anthony Wagstaff both found one each and Bill Bogynska dug two. The SPECIAL token was not recovered.

Member draw (silver half dollar) winner was Don Fantz who also had the oldest coin (1919 wheat). That wheat was one of 22 found at the hunt.

Some items recovered are 23 pieces of non- precious metal jewelry, 13 lbs. of trash including a shot put by Linda Carlson, and \$31.88 in clad coinage totaling \$324.85 for the year. We as a club had an average of 11 lbs. of trash each hunt. That's a total of 132 lbs. of trash gathered at club hunts per year.

- **I WILL** Be an ambassador for the metal detecting hobby. Be polite and informative to those who inquire about your hobby you are the ambassador of a pastime we want to protect and we will be judged by how you act & respond.
- I WILL not misrepresent as to how and when an article was acquired.
