## FIND OF THE MONTH ENTRY FORM UPDATE

It's been nine years since the Find of the Month (FOTM) Entry Form has been updated. Changes have been made that better reflect reality. These have been agreed upon by me, former FOTM committeeman Dick Gaboury and President Pat Williams. The new form has the following revisions:

- 1. The cutoff period for U.S. and oldest coin has been changed from 40 years old to 1964 or older, coinciding with the last silver coinage. In the earlier years of OTTS, the 40 years meant finding a Wheat penny, but as time progresses we now do not consider finding a 1976 penny as worthy of a point.
- 2. The definition of token has been expanded. The prior form was somewhat restrictive and this was not followed in practice. Also, altered coins, such as elongated pennies, are now included here.
- 3. The requirement for unmarked gold or silver has been changed from jeweler's to dealer's certification.
- 4. The price guide for most valuable U.S. coin has been changed from Black Book to Red Book, which has been used for a number of years. Guidelines are also added to reflect changing market conditions of junk silver coins and the valuation of dug coins.
- 5. It has been added in the instructions that coins found in your change do not qualify to be entered. This has always been the rule but some people need to be reminded of it.

I'd like to personally thank Dick Gaboury for his years of service on the FOTM Committee. He will be missed.

New FOTM Committeeman Tim Bogynska has already had over a year of training. He has been doing a lot of the behind the scenes work, which is time consuming. This includes tallying the points on the monthly entry forms, entering them into a spreadsheet and typing the monthly find winners and detectorist standings for the newsletter.

- **I WILL** Be an ambassador for the metal detecting hobby. Be polite and informative to those who inquire about your hobby you are the ambassador of a pastime we want to protect and we will be judged by how you act & respond.
- I WILL not misrepresent as to how and when an article was acquired.
