Gold Class Ring Found & Returned!

In late 2016, Tim and I were out hitting a school ball field. I was digging the usual assortment of pennies and change. I got a solid "78" signal on my trusty White's XLT, so I was expecting to dig another dime. I cut a plug and pulled out a chunk of dirt. I could see an edge and knew immediately what it was due to the weight of the clod. I took it over to Tim, and he knocked the dirt off. There it was: a big gold ring. Sadly, we were so excited that we forgot to get a picture of it covered with dirt.

The ring was 10K gold, 2004 Canby High School. The owner's name was engraved inside. The weight was almost 18 grams, giving it a gold value of almost \$300.

So I set out to find the owner. I did a number of Google searches for the name. There are quite a few people across the US with that same name. The closest match I found was a doctor in Seattle. But he was too old for this ring. With the ring being 12 years old, I figured the owner must be around age 30-31, being age 18-19 as a senior. I checked with several people I know in Canby, but nobody knew of him. I called people in the Canby phone book with the same last name, and they said he was no relation. I figured he must be off in the military.



I was then able to track him down through OSU. I called him and asked him if he ever lost a ring. He said "yes, high schools ring." So we made plans to meet. He drove to my house from Corvallis one Saturday morning, and I gave the big gold ring back to him.

I asked him if he remembered losing it. He said that he had it one day and the next day it was gone. He thought somebody must have stolen it. I said he must of lost it playing ball in the field. He said he didn't ever remember playing ball there, but he could have been throwing a toy with his dog there.

I've told a number of people about finding the ring and returning it. (I am rather proud of it.) Some people don't understand why you'd return something that valuable, because it's the right thing to do. I believe in karma and believe that this will give me more good luck in the future.


