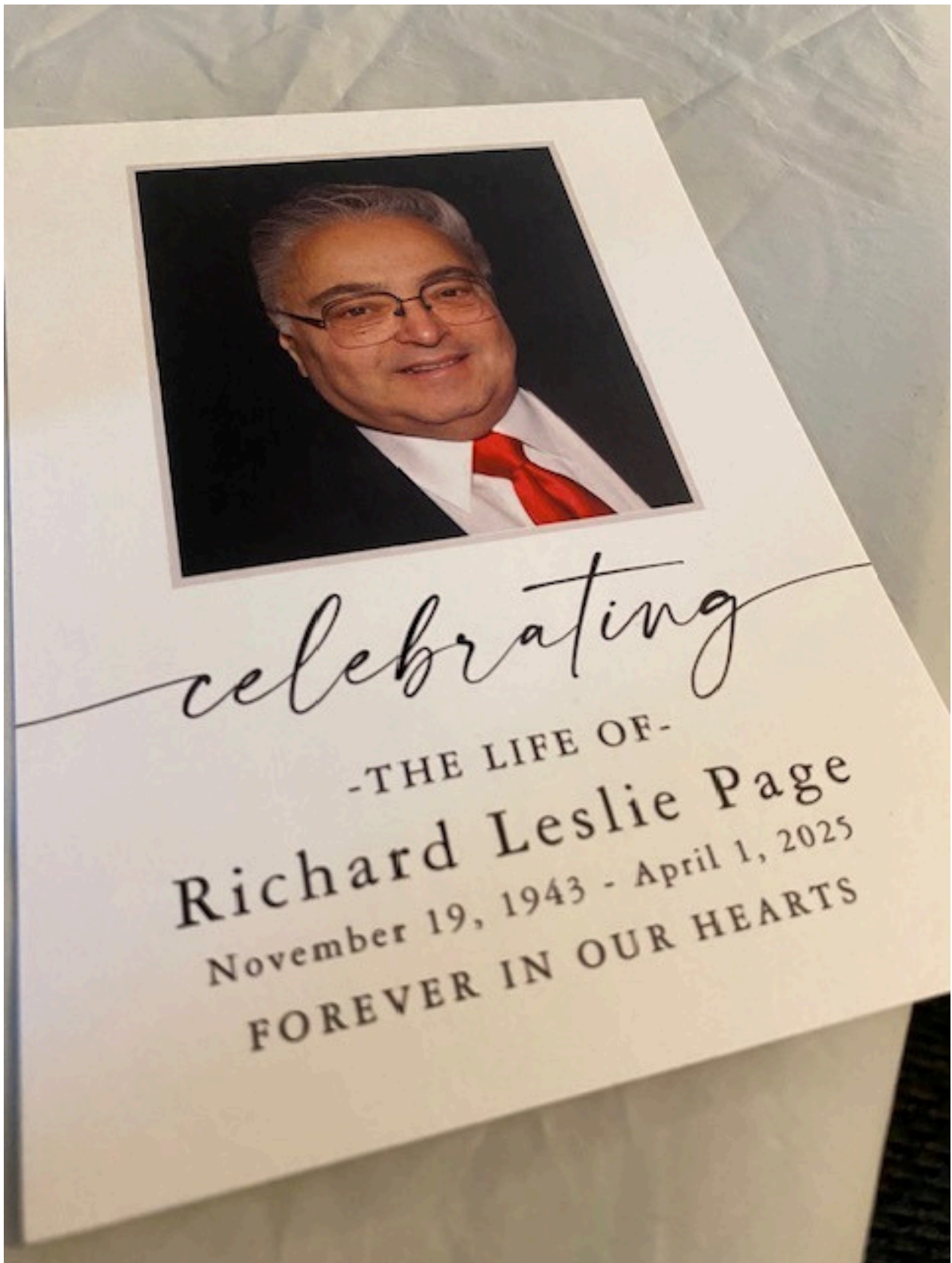

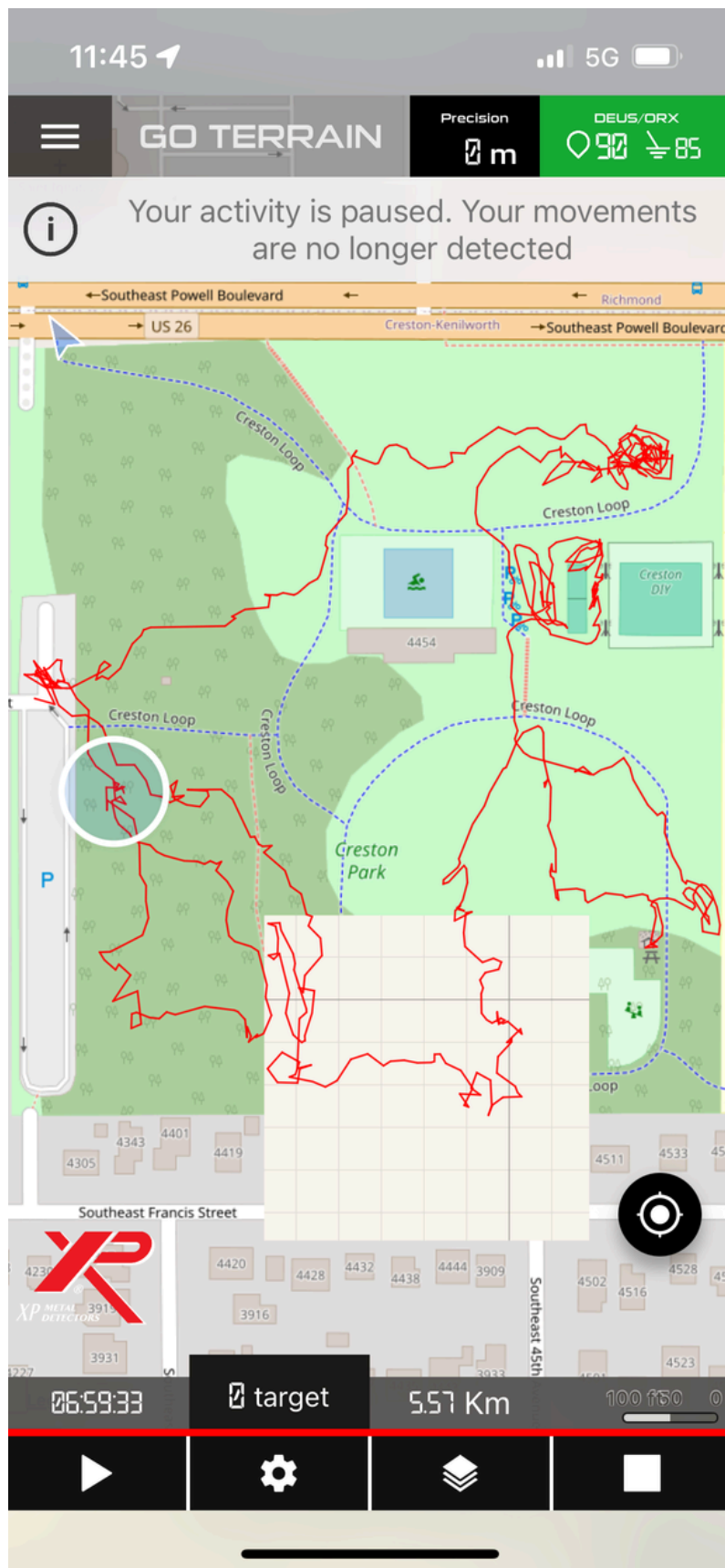

At count out, Alex claimed the silver quarter for the special token. Five club tokens were recovered, so there are still five regular OTTS club tokens hidden which are good for a silver dime at any future meeting. Pull tabs were collected and will be donated to the American Legion.

Thus, I decided to experiment with a chest rig. I also noticed that it's convenient not to have these tools weighing down my finds bag.

In the future, I plan to attach a finds bag to the bottom of the chest rig, along with a method to carry some water.

I've come to realize that I have a limited number of "digs" I can manage in a specific time frame. Efficiency in target acquisition is crucial; the easier it is, the more I can accomplish. I hope this chest rig will help me dig more effectively.

**Hunt Rules:** No digging tools, no pin-pointers, standard coils or smaller only, headphones must be worn (exception: those with hearing issues or non-compatible hearing aids). No one allowed on the hunt field before the hunt. No one is allowed on hunt field during the hunt unless you are a registered and paid hunter. Gloves are highly recommended as coins get hot sitting in the sun and you may want to brush sand away to find targets.
