

Location: Willamette Park, 1100 12th St, West Linn, OR 97068



General Information: Located where the Tualatin River meets the Willamette River, this scenic 15 acre park offers the following amenities: 2 large picnic shelters and a smaller gazebo all with water and power, stage area with concrete pad in front, baseball field, 2 softball fields, 1 grass volleyball court and 1 sand volleyball court, 5 horseshoe pits, river access including boat ramp at Bernert Landing and dock system, playground, wading pool, WiFi, and wildlife viewing.

Historical Information: The park has been around since at least the 1950s.

Hunt Results: The OTTS January Club Hunt was held on Sunday March, 27th 2022. 


