
# **Hunt Results:**

I tossed it in my bag and took it home with me expecting to toss it out once I took a better look at it. I could see in one spot a little silver showing through. I tried to get that crusted covering off of it but had no luck. Then I had a thought... what would Mel Fisher of the Atocha fame do to clean it? I knew he used electrolysis on silver coins he recovered to clean them so I looked it up on the internet. There was a wealth of info on how the processed worked and how to set up a "home grown" version of an electrolysis machine. I had everything in my garage junk and quickly set up a jar and equipment to clean the ring. Once the process started I sat in amazement as I watched the crust start to dissolve before my very eyes. It happen so quickly that I was unable to see the ring about a minute later because the clear water became so murky I couldn't see the ring. After about 5 minutes I decided to shut the process down and check the ring. The ring was cleaned of any crust but still had some residual dirt. I finished cleaning the ring with a tooth brush and detergent. It is marked .925 and is still one of my remarkable finds.


