Club Member's Experiences

Harold V submitted the following questions to the club members:

Why did you join O.T.T.S.?
When did you start detecting?
How many years have you actively detected?
What detector did you start out with? Do you still own it? Do you still use it?

Below are the responses received:

Scott J:

I joined OTTS just over a year ago because my wife bought me a metal detector after our honeymoon (back in 2015) and I didn't know where to go or really how to use it and thought joining a club would provide both motivation and guidance. I started out on a Costco purchased Bounty Hunter but quickly outgrew it after joining the club. It didn't have a built-in pinpoint feature and its inaccuracy can be a bit frustrating so I don't use it anymore, but keep it just in case I need a backup. Currently, I use a Whites MX Sport purchased from Clarence and Mary and I'm still not a pro, but I am learning and getting better all the time. I currently have a little game I am playing where I keep all the change I detect to see if I can collect enough to buy a new machine before I wear out the old one.

Jerry H:

I joined to meet others who enjoy metal detecting and make new friends. Started detecting in 2016. After several months of research my first detector was the Minelab CTX 3030 due to its versatility and being waterproof I also have the Equinox 800 and XP Deus.

Byron D:

I originally joined OTTS to learn and find others of same interest. Started metal detecting in the early 90s with my uncle. I started actively hunting in 1999 when I purchased a Whites XLT [21 years]. My first metal detector was an old Compass [all metal mode only] made in Forest Grove, Or. [yes I still have it, but don't use]. My XLT is the detector that made me love the hobby. I still use it with great success. Having used the XLT for almost 20 years I understand all facets of the machine and am still learning many of the little "idiosyncrasies" of my Whites V3i. As a side note: I received an interesting email from Larry Orr President of Coil and Digger. He suggested when hunting detectorist should have some form of communications device cellphone or walkie talkie when in non-cell phone areas, point taken.

Colleeen V:

I joined because, I am acquainted with Don F and he told me about the club. When I was 10 years old, I had an uncle that detected. He took me with him, and he dug up a gold ring. I have been fascinated with it and any type

of "treasure hunting" ever since! I retired in July 2018, and was given a detector as a retirement gift. Been hunting ever since! I will have been detecting for two years in July of 2020. I use a DEUS XP model EL-HF-RC-WS4. It is my first, and only detector, and I continue to use it I am very pleased with its performance!

Harold V:

Willy A made me join. She had been detecting for about 2years and me about year and a half. She thought it would be a good idea to see what other people are finding, get some tips, have access to the O.T.T.S. picnic, and socialize. I started detecting in July 2017. I had to get my own detector, a Garrett AT Gold, because I got tired of digging Willy's holes. She started in February 2017 with an XP Deus. We "shared" the detecting experience, which meant she found a target and I dug it up. Can't believe it took me 5 months to get my own detector! We have actively been detecting every since we started. After using the Garrett for several months, I decided to get a White's V3I. The Garrett was a great machine in some circumstances, but I always felt I was missing stuff. I spent months wrestling with the V3I and finally came to the conclusion that we didn't meld, so I traded for a Minelab Equinox. I started finding a lot that I was missing with the V3I. Then I realized that I wanted better VDI information, so I bought a Minelab CTX 3030. At the same time. Willy got an Equinox. She got tired of me finding more stuff with the Equinox then she was with the Deus. I still use the Equinox on occasion, but really like the CTX 3030.

Clarence & Mary S:

We knew nothing about metal detecting except it looked like something fun we could do together. We joined the club to learn how to use a detector, where to go, how to recover a target, and meet new people. That was 32 years ago. Since then, we have made lifelong friends, made incredible finds, returned many lost items, and introduced more people to this addictive hobby. We started in 1987. Been actively detecting for 33 years. Started out with a Compass detector. Upgraded to a Tesoro, then finally White's detectors. We still have some of our original machines though we don't use them anymore. Some detectors we have passed on to new users.
