# O.T.T.S. Monthly Club Hunt

January 2022

**Location:** Overlook Park, 1599 N Fremont St, Portland, OR 97227



General Information: Covers 11 acres. Acquired in 1930

**Historical Information:** First designated as a park in 1930, Overlook Park boasts wonderful views of the west hills and downtown Portland along with a range of amenities—basketball court, play structure, baseball diamond, volleyball court, off-leash dog area, and reservable picnic tables to name a few. Mock Crest is a small park offering residents picture-perfect sunset views and a great spot for an afternoon picnic. There are additional parks just a short walking distance from central Overlook in adjacent neighborhoods such as Arbor Lodge and Peninsula Parks.

Overlook has a rich history beginning with the formation of the bluffs it sits upon from debris washed down the Columbia River during the Missoula Floods. During the 1800s—before Overlook was a neighborhood—the area was part of the city of Albina, which incorporated with Portland and East Portland in the 1890s. Businessman and automobile enthusiast Earnest Henry Wemme was the first to invest heavily in real estate in the Overlook neighborhood in the early 1900's. Around this time roads were laid throughout the area and streetcar lines followed development west and north toward St. Johns.

Story about the Walker find: A bucket lister and my first big silver coin! I found a 1945 S Walking Liberty half dollar in a Portland park. It was near the surface and was singing 33-34 on my Equinox. I recognized it as the "dream signal" I've been looking for at least a year, but obviously expected it to be something else. When I flipped over the dirt I saw a flash of silver and my heart started pumping. I took a peek at the edge and when I saw it was indeed a big silver coin, I called my cousin over. We both discovered what it was together and much fist pumping and dancing commenced! I couldn't believe it was a walker and my excitement was off the charts. I was so frazzled I could barely detect the rest of the time. What an amazing experience to find such a beautiful coin!







# **Club Member's Experiences continued**

Story about the Barber Quarter find: Another stunner and oh the stories this coin could tell! I found my first Barber quarter with a legible date, 1900 on the dot. Minted in Philadelphia, it had a vivid life before being lost in Portland. It was a great signal 31-33 on my Equinox and I just had a feeling it was something good, but did not expect 122 year old silver. It was an amazing surprise! I found it in the same general area as my recent Walker half dollar, a spot which has produced a total of: half dollar, quarter, dime, a pair of 1919 wheat pennies, various old tokens, a 14k gold ring, and a silver bracelet. After I found the Walker I poured a ton of effort into digging all the trash, which includes cans, 200+ screw caps and bottle caps, nails, can slaw, pull tabs, you name it. I decided to set up a primitive grid system for myself, and go slow listening to everything. In my first pass across it I went left to right and I dug 17+ signals, this netted the Barber and the Mercury. The second pass was up and down, digging 12+ signals and this led to my surprise a lot of missed copper pennies and dimes. It also led to the gold ring which was a solid 11, and a silver bracelet which was a 21 and I thought was another screw cap. All in all it was an great experience in combing a trashy area that had a proven potential for big ticket finds. I still know I missed things, so I will probably be heading back with my the big coil and listen for deep targets now that I have dug out so much of the surface garbage. What an absolutely crazy way to start the year!


