



My first ever 1909 wheat penny!! What a cool feeling to finally find one after hundred and hundreds of wheaties over the years. The 1909 Lincoln cent was struck to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Abraham Lincoln's birth. The designer was Lithuanian immigrant sculptor Victor D. Brenner. The original design featured the designer's initials "V.D.B" at the bottom of the reverse and those initials were relatively large. 27 million of those were minted until the mint changed the design and removed the initials. 72 million were minted without the initials, of which this one falls into. If this had been a 1909-S VDB oh man... that's the holy grail of small cents. Only 464,000 minted. Fun to get the first of anything and this was no exception!

Then I found more gold. 10kt bracelet




Then I found a creepy 14kt. Pendant.


