Gold and Silver items have been submitted to events and FOTM and been accepted by visual inspection with no positive I.D. will no longer be accepted. Integrity is paramount in our hobby. We as a group must protect our integrity to insure we are fair to all.

One idea the Board has discussed is changing the format of our forms to provide space for you to identify the content of the metal of your find with a verification signature of a board member. We may be obtaining mechanical devices to check the content of gold and platinum. Silver is more difficult to check the actual content and therefore will have to have a visible I.D. to be submitted.

We are all excited when we find a ring or jewelry that has the appearance of value. At our last group hunt I found a Silver pendant with a hallmark. The hallmark was not legible to me so I asked for verification from others. No positive I.D. could be made. This item was entered as a piece of jewelry with 2 points awarded. My integrity was secure. Is yours?

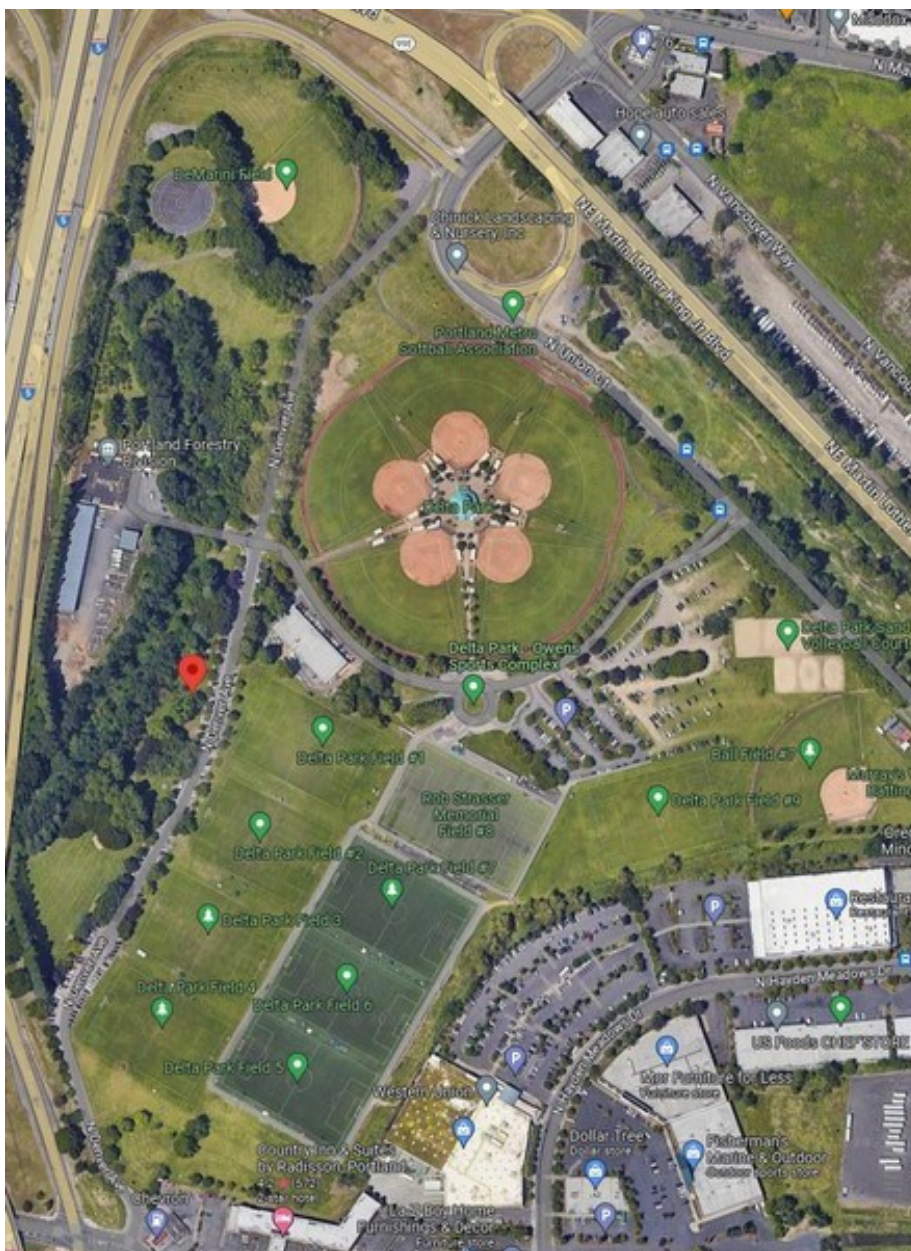
Metal Detectors for Sale:

O.T.T.S. Monthly Club Hunt

July 2nd 2023 Location: Delta Park



General Information: None

Historical Information: Acquired in 1950. Delta Park and the Portland International Raceway were built on the site of the city of Vanport City, which was destroyed by a flood in 1948. Prior to its destruction, Vanport was the second largest city in Oregon. Vanport was constructed in order to house the thousands of war-time shipbuilders that Henry Kaiser, of Henry Kaiser Industries, had recruited from New York to help with the war effort. Vanport, which was constructed in under a year, was deemed 'The Miracle City.' It had its own post office, nine schools, a fire station, a 400-seat cafeteria, a 785-seat theater, a library, a hospital, fourteen playgrounds, five commercial centers, and a police station staffed by twenty-two officers.

Club Hunt Details

Hunt Results: 22 members turned out for the club hunt. Hidden on the day were 10 regular club tokens, two special tokens, two grab bag tokens, and 1 white zinc penny token good for a hat. Jeff won the red flag for the day, planted the flag and then dug up a bottle cap. Nice try!

For natural finds in the park, the club had a really nice day including its best clad day in recent memory finding over \$62 dollars in coins. Ashley found a \$10.85 in clad, as well as a 1949 silver Roosevelt dime! Scott found a 1954 D silver Roosevelt dime. Willy found \$7.78 in clad and Harold found \$4.98. Harold, Jackee, and Lee H. found silver jewelry. Don found the oldest coin on the day, when running his magnet around his pouch a penny stuck to it. After getting a little rust off, it turned out to be a 1943 steel wheat penny! Members found a few wheat pennies and non-club tokens to round out the day.

At count out, Harold claimed a silver Standing Liberty quarter for finding the special token. The other special token good for an 80% 1948 2 Franc was finally found by Jackee after four months. Ed and Chuck, found grab bag tokens and won five seconds to reach in and pull out a prize. Club members turned in 4 of the 10 club tokens good for a silver dime each. The remaining tokens are still in the park and good for a silver dime at any club meeting. The trash derby item was a metal bottle cap of any type, and Harold narrowly beat out Lee S. to win a silver dime. He dug a total of 32 caps on the day. The pull tabs will be donated to the American Legion.

For the membership drawings, Jeff and Don won Franklin half dollars. Ryan won a Washington quarter. There were four extra member draws due to Steve donating 4 pack of finds boxes. Lee H, Richard, Scott, and Laura A. won those. Thanks Steve!

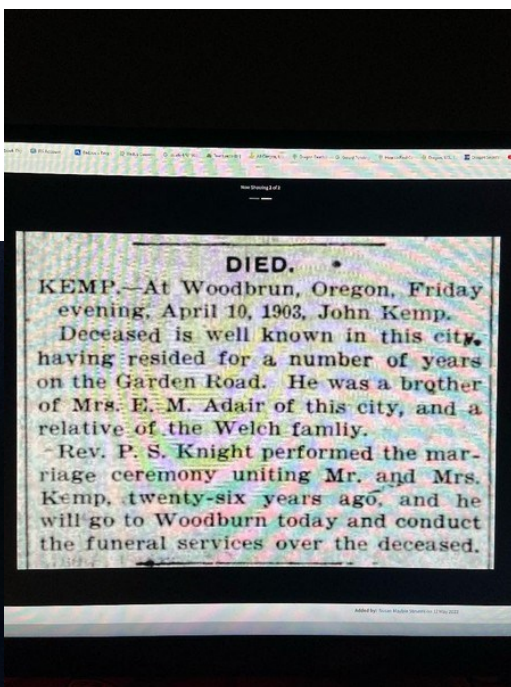
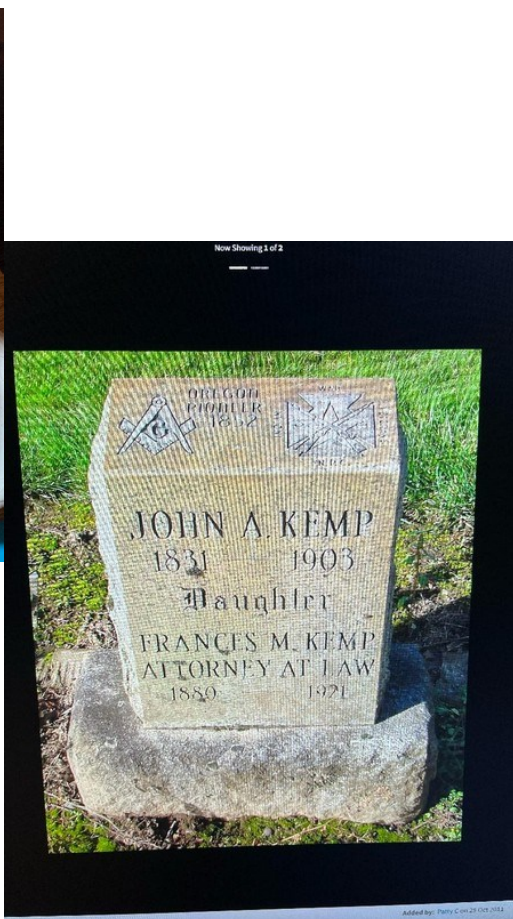
I wanted to include some information about the headstone I brought to the club meeting.

This was found in my grandmother's flowerbed, under some bushes. Before I even moved it I called and asked my Dad about it, and he said they had found it near the old barn in the back when it was torn down. Deciding I owed it the owner to track down the history and place it where it belonged, I took it home and started researching. I signed up for a free trial of ancestry.com which helped me locate by searching birthdates.

Turns it out it belongs to a John A. Kemp, who was born in 1831 in Rocky Mount, VA and is buried in a cemetery not a half mile from my Grandma's house. I was able to find a photo of his current headstone online, which now includes his daughter who died in 1921.

My thought is the headstone was replaced in 1921, and my grandparents didn't buy the house until 1949. So how it got from the cemetery to the house is anybody's guess. There wasn't an obvious family relationship to the previous owner of the house either.

I plan on returning it to the Kemp family if I can find them or placing it in a better permanent location than a flowerbed.

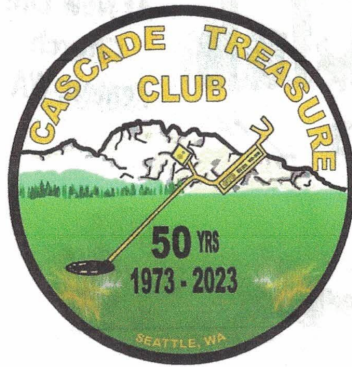

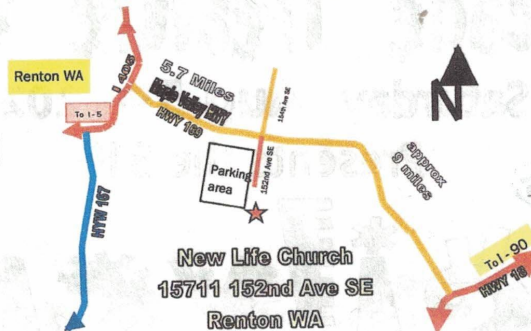

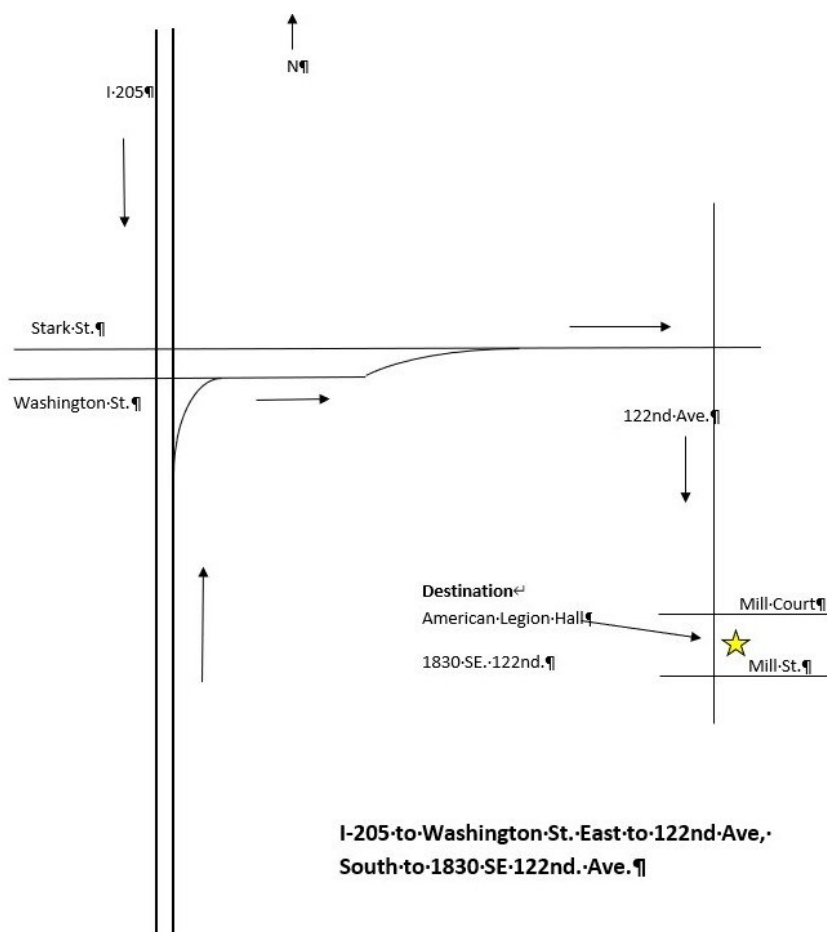
