



Club Hunt Details


Hunt Results: The OTTS January Club Hunt was held on Saturday February, 26th 2022. We met at the Walgreens located at 9855 SW Capitol Hwy, Portland, OR 97219. 17 members left for the park at 8:57AM. The ground was soft and clouds kept it cool with a little sprinkle of rain towards the end.

Ryan P. and Matt N. hid 10 regular tokens and one special token. The club turned in a great token effort, finding seven of the regular tokens and the special token! Tim S. found the special token hidden in a sand pit and won a 1964 quarter. Several members reported finding club tokens buried 2-3 inches, indicating they were from previous club hunts at the site. The remaining club tokens from Saturday are still at the site.

Ron B. won the membership drawing, winning a 1964 Kennedy half dollar.

There was a surprise category and a silver dime was awarded to anyone who recovered a dog tag.

In an amazing turn of events, Laura A. found the oldest coin on the day, a 1899 V nickel, but it wasn't discovered until she was cleaning up her coins at home! At the count out, Ryan P. turned in a 1944 wheat penny for the oldest coin (and was the only wheat penny found). Matt N. found a stellar silver and gold ring with black hills gold leafing stamped "STERLING 10K." Jerry H. found two silver rings and Harold, Laura, Ryan, and Allisyn contributed to the total of seven silver finds. Ryan found the only foreign coin, a 1971 Japanese 10 yen coin. Members found 25 pieces of costume jewelry.






Club Member's Experiences continued


