

O.T.T.S. Monthly Club Hunt

March 30, 2024 Location: Pier Park, Portland, OR



General Information: None

Historical Information: Year acquired 1920 • Size in acres 85.00

The park was named for Stanhope S. Pier, who served as a Portland city commissioner in the late 1920s and as acting mayor in 1931. In 1930, Commissioner Pier proposed several improvements, including a pool in Albina, the expansion of Mt Scott and Lents Parks, and the development of Pier Park in the style of Laurelhurst, then considered the most beautiful park in the city.

Club Hunt Details

Hunt Results:

20 members and 1 guest turned out for a beautiful day to have a March club hunt. Ryan hid 10 regular club tokens in the park and five special tokens. Ryan announced there would be a special raffle at count out and trash found would increase your raffle odds. The prize for the extra raffle was a Franklin silver half dollar Christmas hunt.

The club found some nice items in the park. Willy, Tim, Jackee and Ryan found silver dimes. Ryan found a buffalo nickel. Harold found an older silver ring stamped sterling. Members found 21 wheat pennies, the oldest confirmed one found by Ryan was 1918 which also won the oldest coin. Jerry found a probable 1914 but it was beyond confirmation. The club also found some foreign coins, tokens and costume jewelry. Laura S. found 35 bullet casings for a whopping 70 points in the competition hunt!

At count out seven club tokens were turned in, and all five of the special ones. Jerry won a 1930 Standing Liberty Quarter. Sean won a 1943 Canadian Quarter. Harold won a 40% JFK for finding the golden nickel. Harold and Laura S. found grab bag tokens and got to try their luck. The other three club tokens are still in the park, they are good for a silver dime at any club meeting. Pull tabs were collected and will be donated to the American Legion.

For the membership drawings, Tom and Ed won half dollars, Jerry won the Standing Liberty quarter. For the bonus raffle, Ryan used his iPhone app to input the total number of trash found for each person. Then a drawing was held automatically and Harold won a silver half.
