Club Hunt Details

Hunt Results: 22 members turned out for the club hunt. Hidden on the day were 10 regular club tokens, two special tokens, two grab bag tokens, and 1 white zinc penny token good for a hat. Kirk helped Ryan out by hiding all the tokens and hid a few goodies of his own. A lead token was good for a Mexican Olympic silver coin, and a plastic Easter egg full of pull tabs was good for a Barber quarter. Jackee found the lead token and Jerry found the pull tab egg. Thanks Kirk for adding in some additional fun (the extra prizes were donated by Kirk). Richard was given the red flag for the day, planted the flag and then dug up a bottle cap. Nice try!

For natural finds in the park, the club did great. Ryan found a 1935 silver Washington quarter. Tom found a 1953 Roosevelt dime. Tim and Richard found silver rings. Steve found the oldest coin on the day, a 1929 S wheat penny. Ed and Bruce found foreign coins and won a cool foreign coin donated by Steve. Bruce won a French 5 Centimes from the late 1700s and Ed won a 1907 Swiss 5 Rappen coin. Members found a good amount of wheat pennies and non-club tokens.

At count out, Lee claimed a silver quarter for finding the special token. The other special token good for a 1948 2 Franc was not found and Kirk recovered it. Allisyn and Tim got to try the grab bag, getting five seconds to reach in and pull out a prize. Allisyn pulled out a nice non-precious ring, and Tim pulled out a Mercury dime! Club members turned in 7 of the 10 club tokens good for a silver dime each. The remaining tokens are still in the park and good for a silver dime at any club meeting. The trash derby item was again a pull tab, and Jeff narrowly beat out Dan by one pull tab to win a silver dime. He dug a total of 26 pull tabs on the day. The pull tabs will be donated to the American Legion.

For the membership drawings, Laura and Jeff both won Franklin half dollars. Allisyn won a Washington quarter. There were two extra member draws due to Ryan and Tom finding silver coins, and Tim pulled out his own number to win a Mercury dime. Scott won the other one.

The next club hunt will again feature a special token good for a 1948 Swiss 2 Franc donated by Ed.

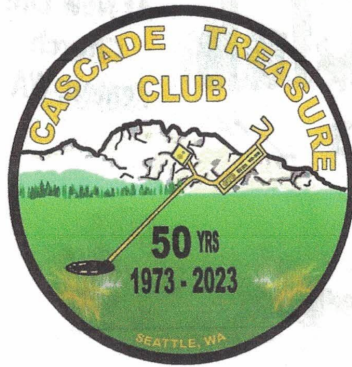

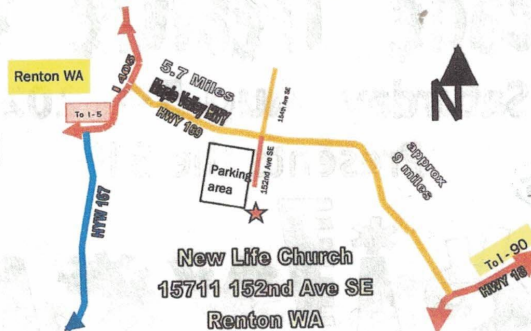

Silver Dollar Raffle: There will be several drawings for a silver dollar throughout the day.

Main Raffle: Tickets will be available throughout the day. Prizes include: a "Lions Lair Treasure Feast," a Gold Coin, Metal Detector as well as other great prizes.

3rd hunt: 1:45 - 2:45pm **Lion's Lair.** (Distribution of the kill) The family Feast.—During the last 15 minutes of this hunt, the other two fields will be re-opened to hunt as well. You will be able to use any prize tokens you find. This hunt will have prizes (including 1200+ silver coins, metal detector and a gold coin) as well as mix of coins and lion surprises.

Hunt rules: New Life Church is allowing us to use their property—please treat their field and property with respect: tokens and coins will not be buried—just hidden in the grass. Hunting in the fields prior to or after the hunt is not allowed. You may use only one detector & pin pointer. Only registered hunters are allowed on fields during hunts (exceptions must be cleared in advance by hunt Chairpersons). Thunder Storms will delay or stop a hunt. If one occurs, the hunt may resume after the storm passes.

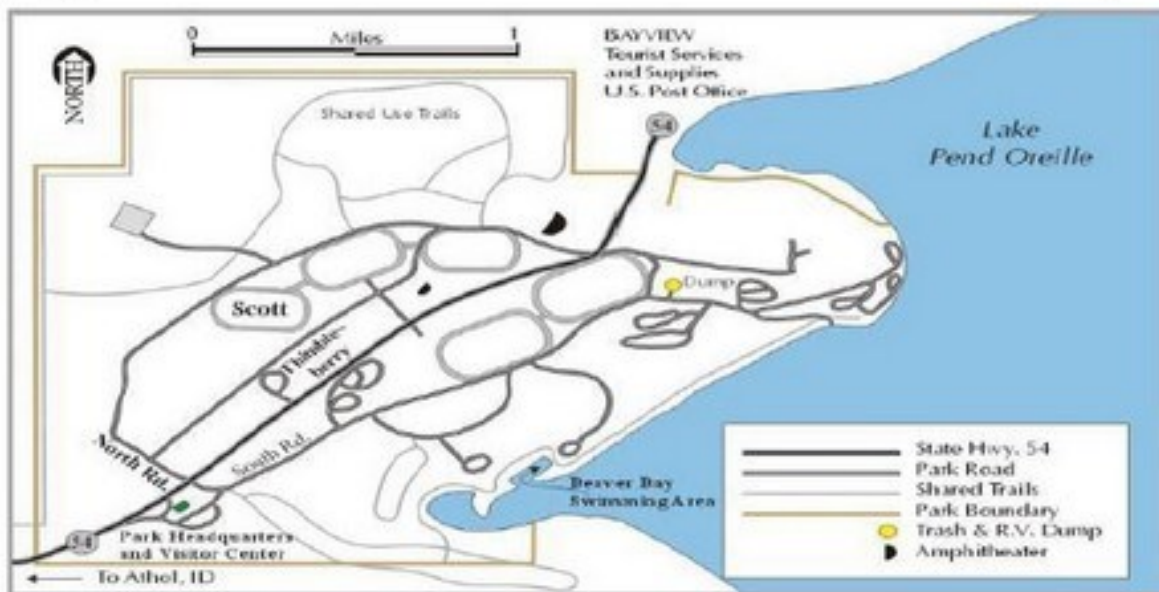
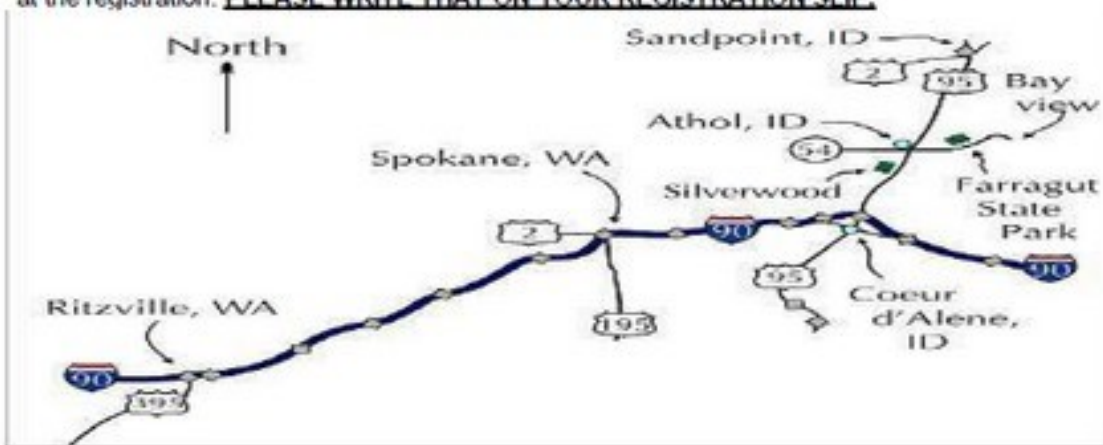

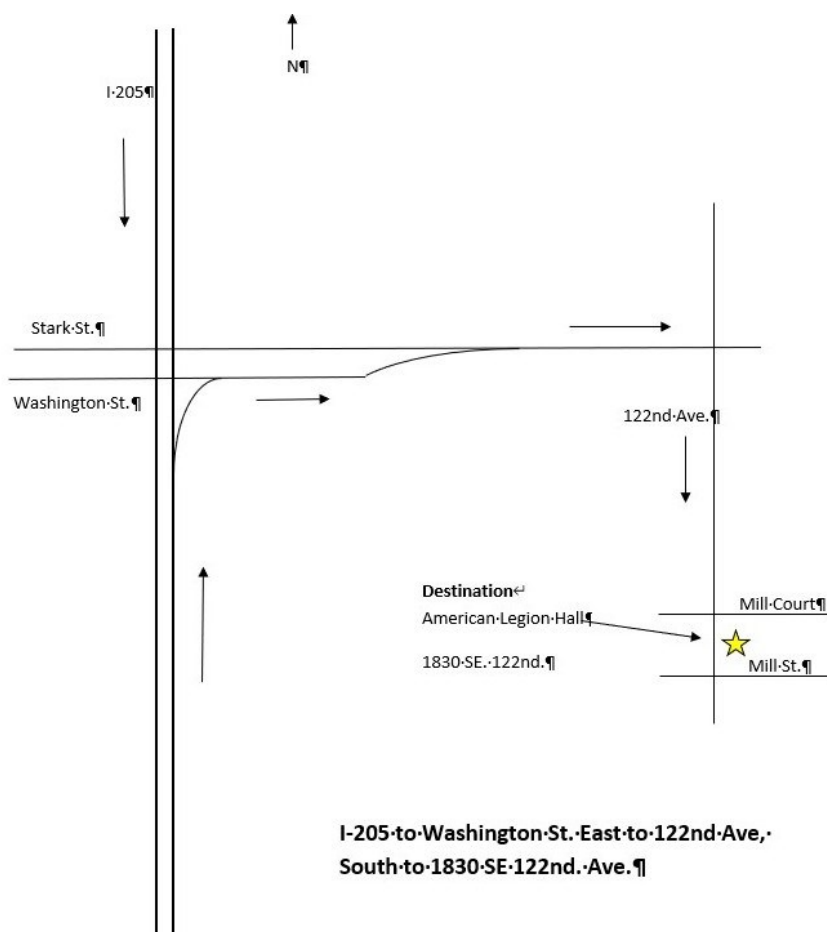
