






# **O.T.T.S. Monthly Club Hunt**

August 2022

Location: Sellwood Riverfront Park & Sellwood Park



**General Information:** 8 acres was acquired by the City of Portland in 1969. Prior to that it appears to have been unimproved land.

## **Club Hunt Details**

**Hunt Results:** The OTTS June Club Hunt was held on Saturday July, 2nd 2022. We met at the New Seasons at 1214 SE Tacoma St, Portland, OR 97202. 12 members of the club and 1 guest met between 7:15 and 7:45 am. Ryan P. announced that all of the club tokens were hidden in the Riverfront park and that there was beach access available for anyone who didn't want to dig in the ground. Ryan said that if members wanted to hunt the adjacent Sellwood Park, any finds would be allowed at count out time. The club left for the park at 8 am sharp. Ryan P. hid 8 regular tokens, one special token, and two grab bag tokens. General location of the tokens was given, but the club turned in a mediocre effort recovering only four club tokens, but both grab bag tokens and the special token. The remaining club tokens are still in the park. Laura S. won the membership drawing, winning a 1962 Franklin half dollar.

2 Special Grab Bag Tokens: Harold V. found both grab bag tokens and was given two 5 second attempts to pull something from the mystery bag. His first attempt netted him a junk ring, but on his second attempt Harold pulled out a beautiful 1878 Seated Liberty dime! Congrats to Harold on a great day at the club hunt!

Jackee A. found a 1928 S wheat penny and won the oldest coin for the day. Harold V. found a gold 14k ring with a blue gem and silver bracelet. Other notable finds included a silver ring found by new member Shelly T. Guest Dan C. found a silver necklace, and Ryan P. found a pair of silver rings. Lee H. found a really cool old button.

A special thanks to Don S. who donated some of his own silver quarters and dimes for giving away as special prizes in future club hunts!

**Next Club Hunt:** Matt N. and Ryan P. will be hosting the next club hunt on October 2nd (Sunday). We will be using normal hours (8am - 12pm). The club has been enjoying access to beaches on club hunts during this hot summer, and this one will be more of that opportunity while the ground is still concrete. This club hunt is going to be a bit different, as the meeting site is the hunt location: Frenchman's Bar Regional Park in Vancouver located at 9612 NW Lower River Rd, Vancouver, WA 98660. The club hunt will feature the normal competition hunt and club tokens, but in addition, a tournament for junk rings will be held for extra prizes. The hunt masters will seed junk rings donated by Kirk E. throughout the park. So come ready to dig all those mid tones! The normal pre-hunt briefing will be held at 8 am in the parking lot to go over the rules, so no hunting until the hunt masters have said go! This park requires a \$3 parking fee so you may wish to check with other members for carpooling options. Please do not arrive prior to 7:00 am, but allow some extra time to pay for parking. The parking kiosks accept cards and cash.



## **Metal Detectors for Sale:**



I saw this gold poking through the sound and I thought for sure I had a nice big gold ring. I was sorely disappointed.




