





For natural finds in the park, Ed found a small round pendant housing that later tested as 10k. Richard found his first silver coin - a 1960 Roosevelt dime. No silver jewelry items were found which is rare. Jason found a 1929 wheat penny which won the oldest coin.

At count out, Alex claimed the silver quarter for the special token. Five club tokens were recovered, so there are still five regular OTTS club tokens hidden which are good for a silver dime at any future meeting. Pull tabs were collected and will be donated to the American Legion.

For the membership drawings, Jackee and Gregg won half dollars. Tim won a silver quarter.

Equipment, Tips & Tricks



I am a dork!

I have been carrying my finds bag, shovel, and pointer across my shoulder and chest for quite a while. I appreciate having easy access to my digging tools while on the ground, as it makes it simpler to take them out or put them back.

Thus, I decided to experiment with a chest rig. I also noticed that it's convenient not to have these tools weighing down my finds bag.

In the future, I plan to attach a finds bag to the bottom of the chest rig, along with a method to carry some water.

I've come to realize that I have a limited number of "digs" I can manage in a specific time frame. Efficiency in target acquisition is crucial; the easier it is, the more I can accomplish. I hope this chest rig will help me dig more effectively.




