

Club Hunt Report

Date:June 29, 8am-12pm

Location: Lake Sacajawea Park, Longview, WA



Hunt Results: 16 members and 1 guest came out to the monthly club hunt held in Longview. Don hid a total of 15 regular club tokens and only six were found.

For natural finds in the park, Jeff and Allisyn found silver coins dated 1943. Jeff's was a Walking Liberty half dollar and Allisyn's was a Mercury dime. Two 35% silver War Nickels were found, one silver foreign coin and one silver ring rounded out the silver finds for the day.

The top places in the competition hunt were:

- 1) Ashley113 pointsPrize: silver quarter
- 2) Jeff 105 pointsPrize: silver quarter
- 3) Tim95 pointsPrize: silver quarter
- 4) Scott79 pointsPrize: silver dime
- 5) Lee76 pointsPrize: silver dime

Equipment, Tips & Tricks

Ed V has this fantastic contribution for this section.

After several months of metal detecting the coins I find are ready for a cleaning and return to the bank. Here are the steps I take to do that.

- 1. Separate all of the nickels, dimes and quarters from the pennies. If you don't, all your silver will have a copper tint after you tumble them.
- 2. I use a Frankford Arsenal tumbler (typically used for cleaning brass cartridges). I can tumble up to 18 lbs of coins at a time.
 - a. Load coins into tumbler, fill 90% full of water and a small amount of dish soap. Tumble for about 10 minutes.
 - b. Empty the "muddy" water out and refill with clean water and another couple of drops of dish soap.
 - c. Tumble for 1 to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours. Empty the water again and inspect coins. If you still have some with heavy tarnish you can refill it with water and add $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of lemon juice and tumble for another 30 minutes.
 - d. Rinse coins and lay them out to dry.
- 3.3. If you have a bank that will put them through their sorting machine you can do that. I have a Royal Sovereign Coin Sorter that I use to sort them and put them in to coin rolls.

In a typical metal detecting year I will put between \$400-\$500 worth of coins back into my hobby to help pay for gas and hunts.


