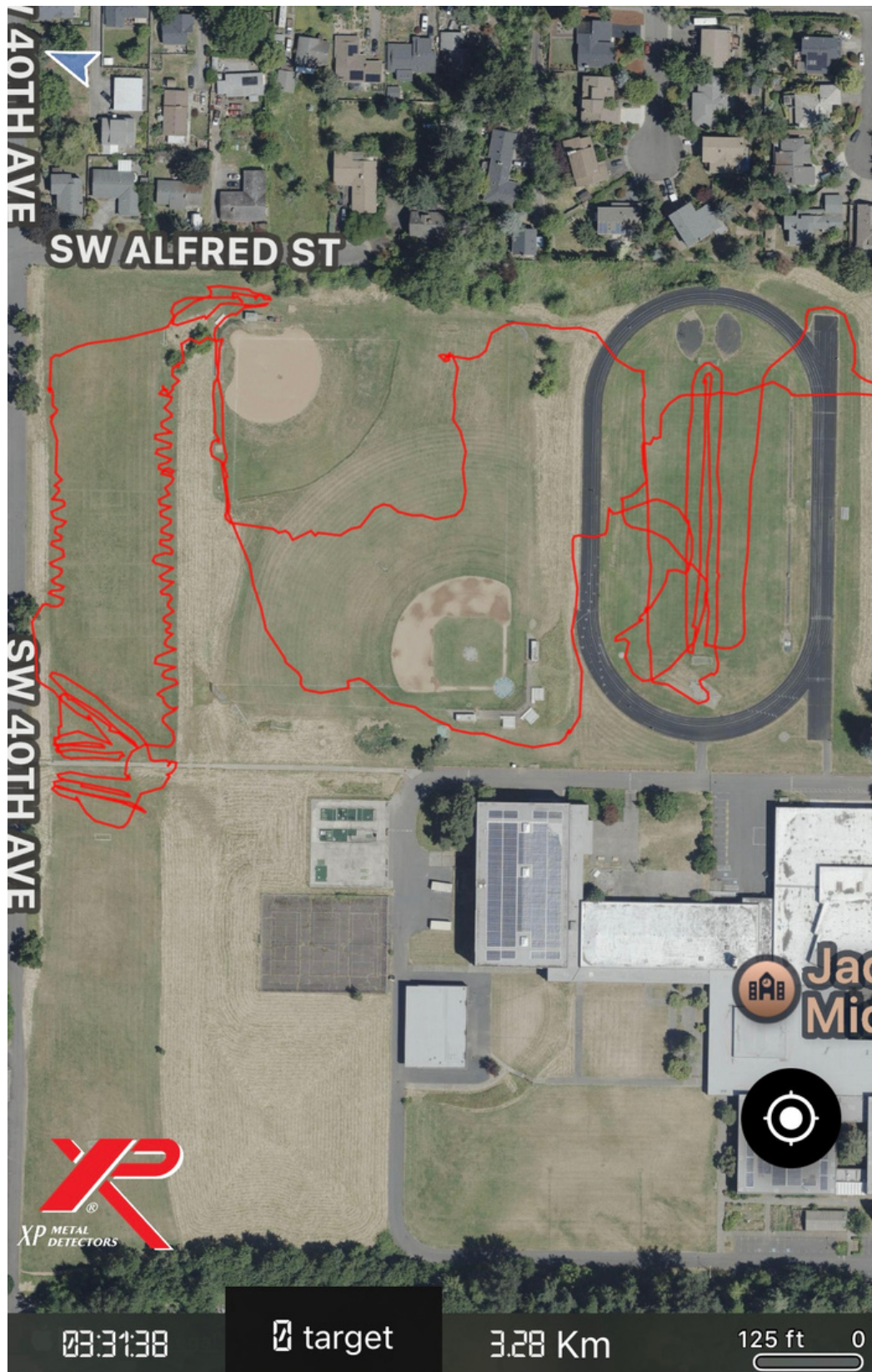

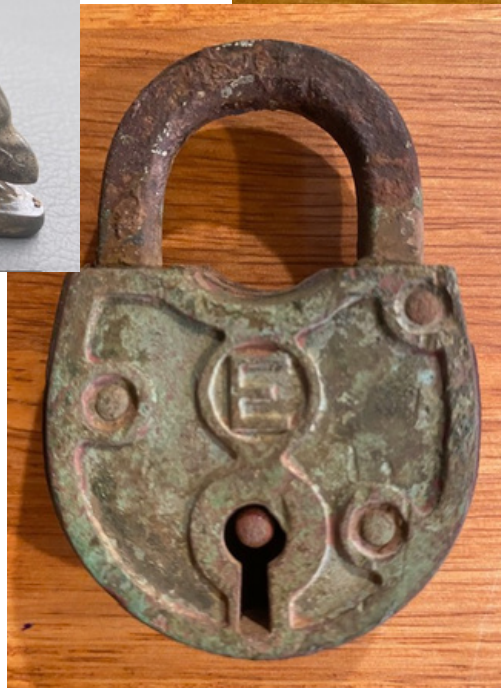

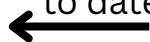

Club Hunt Report



Date: March 29, 8am-12pm

Location: Jackson Middle School, Portland, OR

Hunt Results: 20 members came out on a nice Saturday morning for the March club hunt. Jackee hid the tokens so Ryan could participate in the token searching (he didn't find one). A total of 10 regular club tokens and two special tokens were hidden.

For natural finds at the school, Ryan found a spill containing a 1960 silver dime, 1941 nickel, 1962 Canadian penny, and a 1967 memorial. Two silver jewelry items were found by Brian and Jackee. Don found a penny hoard with eight wheaties. Newer member Gregg found his first ring. Scott counted out 15 pencil eraser tops! Club members also found two club tokens from previous events, as they were buried.

At count out, Ed claimed the silver quarter for the special token. Six club tokens were recovered, two of them old, so there are at least six or more club tokens still at the school. They are good for a silver dime at any future meeting. Pull tabs were collected and will be donated to the American Legion.

For the membership drawings, Clark and Ashely won half dollars. Fabian won a silver quarter.

Nokta AccuPOINT - \$149.00

Recently, I wore out the plastic tip on my old pin pointer and had my eye on this model. I must say, it hasn't disappointed me. After using it for about three weeks, I find the discrimination tones extremely useful when searching in a hole. The rechargeable battery life is impressive; it claims to last 35 hours, and it seems to deliver, as I haven't needed to recharge it since taking it out of the box. I appreciate the "instant on" feature, especially since my previous pin pointer took a few seconds to power up. While it took some time to adjust to navigating the menu, I'm getting the hang of it and really enjoy using it. Although it's meant to pair with my headset, I wasn't able to connect it, but that's not a dealbreaker for me. It is a bit pricey, but I don't regret the purchase so far. At this point, I would recommend this tool.

The 2025 OTTS Memorial Hunt will be seeded with over 500 silver coins; clad coins, prize tokens, silver jewelry, old coins, treasure chest keys (one unlocks the goodies) and who knows what else. **Items will be on the surface or lightly covered in sand.**

Hunt Rules: No digging tools, no pin-pointers, standard coils or smaller only, headphones must be worn (exception: those with hearing issues or non-compatible hearing aids). No one allowed on the hunt field before the hunt. No one is allowed on hunt field during the hunt unless you are a registered and paid hunter. Gloves are highly recommended as coins get hot sitting in the sun and you may want to brush sand away to find targets.
