Early Literacy Facts (Scottish Book Trust):

 A child needs to hear 1,000 stories before he/she will learn to read

- Books contain 50 percent more "rare" words than prime-time television
- The child who knows four nursery rhymes by age four will naturally be a better reader by age eight
- 50 percent of words in the English language can be sounded out phonetically while the other half you just need to recognize when reading
- A child needs to hear a word 250 times before he/she will remember it
