

Transit

The Metro Ride is a system of buses that travel the city to help people get from place to place.


Planning your trip: All of the bus routes have a name, letter, and a color to help you match the maps with the schedule.

To catch a bus: Go to the street with the route you wish to ride and find the bus stop sign. Signs are usually found on every other block. Wait by the sign for your bus to arrive.

Paying your fare: Pay the driver as you board the bus. Cash and tokens may be inserted into the top of the cash box. Costs can range from \$1.75 for one adult to free for children under 5 years of age. Change is not given.

When on board: Take your seat quickly because the bus will start moving. You may request to have the driver wait if needed.

Getting off the bus: About one block away from where you wish to get off the bus, pull the cord found above or alongside the windows.




Monthly Pass: If you ride the bus often, buy a monthly pass to ride the bus as much as you would like.



HEALTH PROVIDERS

Choosing a doctor can be a challenge, especially if you are from a different community. Asking for opinions from friends and neighbors is a good way to start, but you have to pick which doctor is going to be the best fit for you.

Providers:

One That is Going to Treat Your Needs

It is important to pick a provider you can trust and communicate well with. Make sure you choose a doctor who you feel comfortable with.

One Who Works With Your Insurance

If you have health insurance, start by finding out which providers are covered by your plan in your area. If you do not have health insurance, talk with your future doctor about future costs.

Location

How far away is the clinic or hospital? Will it be easy to get to either using a car or bus?

Will the Doctor Be Available When You Need an Appointment?

What hours are they open? Are they open weekends, evenings, or have emergency hours? Can you talk to them on the phone?



HOW TO ESTABLISH A PROVIDER

After finding a provider that fits your needs:

- Call the office of the provider
- receptionist transfer you to the provider or provider's nurse

Have the

- Schedule a meeting with the provider
- Talk with them to decide if they are right for you



How to Book Your Appointments:

- Call the clinic/hospital that you want to attend
- Tell the receptionist your provider's name and your reason to see them
- Select the best date and time available for you

Use a translator if you do not speak good English

If your need is immediate, go to the walk-in clinic

If your need is an emergency, go to the closest emergency room

- If possible, ask someone to go with you to help you understand and remember answers to your questions
 - Bring questions that you may have about your health
 - Take notes. If you do not understand what the doctor or nurse is saying, ask them to repeat it or write it down for you
 - Have the doctor or nurse write down the next steps they want you to take for your health
 - After the appointment, the office will give you a summary of what happened during the appointment.
 Be sure to ask for a copy and confirm that your next appointments are listed on the paper


Levels of Healthcare for Health Concerns

Walk-In Clinic: They offer same-day care for minor illnesses and health care needs for both adult and child patients

Urgent Care: They are for when you cannot wait to make an appointment with your doctor, but you do not need emergency services

Emergency Room: Always go to the ER when your life is at risk. The staff is ready for any critical situation 24/7

Chest pain, difficulty breathing, weakness/numbness on one side, slurred speech, fainting/change in mental state, serious burns, head or eye injury, concussion/confusion, fever with a rash, seizures, facial cuts, severe cuts, broken bones or dislocated joints, severe cold/flu symptoms, vaginal bleeding with pregnancy

While this is a general guideline, please consult with your doctor

Urgent Care

Fever without a rash, vomiting or continual diarrhea, stomach pain, wheezing or shortness of breath, dehydration, moderate flu-like symptoms, sprains and strains, small cuts that may require stitches

Sports physicals (no labs), mild flu-like symptoms, cough and congestion symptoms, sore throat, ear pain, eye redness, painful urination, rashes without fever

Recommendations:

- Varicella (chicken pox)
- Polio (IPV)
- Hepatitis A (HepA)
- Hepatitis B (HepB)
- HPV
- Pneumococcal
- Tetanus (Td, Dtap, tDap)
- Meningitis
- Influenza
- Covid-19
- Shingles

Information:

- Vaccines help your body by strengthening its ability to fight disease.
- It is recommended for children to receive: MMR, varicella, polio, HepA, and HepB vaccines
- It is recommended for adolescents to receive: HPV, Meningitis (preteens with a booster around age 16)
- It is recommended for all individuals to receive: Tetanus, DTaP for children, Tdap for preteens, Td or Tdap for adults (every 10 years)
- It is recommended for all individuals to also receive: Influenza (seasonally in the fall), COVID-19 with boosters; speak with your healthcare provider about receiving boosters, Pneumococcal, Shingles (above 50 if you have had varicella)

nsurance

What is health insurance?

An agreement where your health insurer pays some or all of your healthcare costs in exchange for a

premium.

Terms



Deductible: the amount you pay before your health insurer starts paying

Coinsurance: the percentage of the costs you pay after your deductible is reached

Copay: the amount you pay a healthcare provider for a single service

Max out-of-pocket: maximum amount of money you will pay in a health insurance plan year (also called "Copay")

Benefit period: the time period when services are covered



STEPS TO ENROLL

1 TALK WITH A GUIDE

There are people in the community who want to help you apply for health insurance. Speak with a health insurance navigator at locations like the Wausau Free Clinic to help guide you. You can also call 211 to find people who can help you.

2 KNOW YOUR INFORMATION

Have your information ready for household members including Social Security numbers and income information; call 211 for complete information about documents needed to apply for coverage through the ACA Marketplace or through BadgerCare

3 DETERMINE YOUR NEEDS


Determine the health needs of you and your family as well as what you can afford. The health insurance plan you choose is your decision based on what you need covered. Based on your income level, you may qualify for low-cost plans.


4 DOES YOUR CLINIC ACCEPT YOUR HEALTH INSURANCE?

Every healthcare clinic accepts different kinds of insurance. It is necessary that the clinic you wish to get medical help from accepts your insurance plan. Call your clinic or doctor to find out which insurance they accept.

5 PAY

Once you decide on a plan, the last step is to pay and signup. You must pay your health insurer every month to keep your plan.












WHY IS YOUR MENTAL HEALTH IMPORTANT?



VICTIM ADVOCACY

A SAFE PLACE

Domestic Abuse: a pattern of behavior used to gain power or control a partner using any of the following:

- Emotional/Verbal Abuse: hurting someone's emotions through language and verbal control
- Isolation: keeping someone away from support or social involvement
- Threats/Intimidation: making someone afraid through looks, actions, destroying property, or harming pets
- Economic/Financial Abuse: holding back money, job, or bank accounts
- Physical Abuse: pushing, punching, kicking, choking, or other bodily harm against someone
- **Sexual Abuse:** forcing or pressuring any sex act or activity upon another person without consent
