The figure of Krampus originally comes

- like many other demonic figures of the
Alpine region – from pre-Christian times,
while his milder counterpart, Knecht
Rupprecht, is the assistant of Saint
Nicholas, who in the traditions of the
northern and central German-speaking
area comes on the eve of December 6th.
Both serve as corrective figures that
accompany Saint Nicholas. As he deals out
treats, they deal out coals and rod beatings
for naughty children.

This presentation will delve into the myths and legends of the Krampus/Knecht Rupprecht and similar figures.
