God's Detours in Life

Many things befall us on life's way. Unexpected blessings. Expected blessings. Tragedies. Disappointments. However, when you look at things through the mind and will of God, all things in life are Blessings because they fulfill Romans 8:28 Do you ever hear someone say that they are pretty good "under the circumstances?" Zig Ziglar, my favorite motivational speaker, always said we have no business being "under" anything, except the direction of the Holy Spirit. But peak season was in full swing on this side of the mountain and we were blessed once again by spectacular beauty we otherwise would have missed! Then I took a wrong turn in Gainesville, Ga, and drove by Free Chapel. I had wanted to see Jentezen Franklin's church, but would never take the time to locate it. God did it for me.

Detours come normally without notice. Adversity comes the same way. Sickness, great trials, the "Purosis" (fiery trial) and "Peirasmos" (trial sent by God) may be a Godly detour. But since we live on a sin cursed earth, our bodies will be afflicted by disease and eventually death. But before the detour is over we can see God's hand in it. Jesus said don't worry about tomorrow, it will take care of itself. We don't know how long detours will be. I don't think John Bunyan knew from the start he would be in jail 12 years. We don't like to travel on some detours, like rough, steep, or winding mountain roads that are so rough they will shake the devil out of us!

Some detours have good points. Major highways may be filled with billboards, but you see God's nature on country roads. Some people try to refuse the detours just like we do in our Spiritual life. Some had rather grumble all the time. Instead, we should rejoice in life, and be happy with God's blessings, knowing something better lies ahead. Moses detoured to see the burning bush, and look how God used him. Abraham took a detour that he, too, did not know where it would lead, but he trusted God. God used an angel to detour Balaam when he refused to listen to his donkey. Jonah took off on his own detour, but God detoured him back on the right path using a great fish that He had prepared. God's detour for Paul on the Damascus road changed the course of Christianity forever.
