A Visit With Dr. John

As I write this, it has been 26 days since I first started having COVID-19 symptoms. I was diagnosed with it a couple days later. My son John and I had it around the same time. For the first eight days or so, we seemed to be in about the same shape. Then he started improving and getting stronger. I seemed to be getting

beyond the COVID symptoms except I began to get weaker.

I suppose my case was a mild one. I did not have to be hospitalized. Nor did I have to have a ventilator. My lungs seemed to be pretty clear. Still, after about eight days I became really weak. for nearly 2 weeks, it was difficult to even hold up my head. I don't believe that I have ever been more weak. And I am still far from being even close to 100% of normal. I am thankful for so many of you who prayed for me. And please don't stop that. I am thankful for the Lord helping me through this tough time.

Also, let me encourage you to take care that you do not contract the Coronavirus. I surely do not want it again. It is worth doing the distancing, handwashing, staying away from crowds, and wearing a mask to avoid the problem. All people who bear the responsibility of gathered people need to remember that their health may be in our hands regarding what we ask them to do. So, be responsible with your place of leadership.

Like many of our churches, so many activities of the association have been canceled or put on hold. We must understand that the essence of our work still can continue even during this time. We do not have to have large gatherings in order to worship. We do not have to have large gatherings in order to share the gospel. We can do this with simply another person or with two or

It would not hurt us to remember that our personal testimony of faith in Christ and love for Him has tremendous importance. People can still come to know Christ during this time.
