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


What do we notice?

D15 made gains in overall YTD Attendance. Still remain as district with 5th highest YTD

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

All Students Learn to Read Well

Improve Foundational Literacy:

 Provide training for teachers to enhance Tier 1 Foundational Skills (Heggerty Phonemic Awareness) in K-2 classrooms.

Use Data to Inform Instruction:

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• Analyze screener data to group students by skill level and adjust instruction accordingly.

Implement Small Group Instruction:

- Leveraging NYSIP Grants funds to implement Tier 2 Foundational Reading instruction in select schools.
- Inquiry cycle case studies between screener benchmarks to adjust instruction and ensure progress for all students.

M.S. 136 Strategic Reading Period (SRP) Case Studies

All Students are Physically and Emotionally Safe

- Established partnerships with Ackerman Institute for the families, NYU Nest, Art Therapy Project, and History Unerased to support in professional development district-wide.
- All guidance counselors and social workers have had access to learning plan trainings offering different modalities such as play therapy, art therapy, and topics including LGBTQ, ASD, etc. to support with at-risk counseling.
- Art therapy sessions have been offered at high-needs schools.

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- ABA Series offered for the district by a a BCBA Coach working within our district schools
- Counseling specific resources are provided for all school counselors and social workers for high-quality student care
- Superintendent Townhalls focusing on how to support the wellbeing of students;
 Bullying, LGBTQ Inclusivity, Drug Prevention etc.

All Students Graduate College and Career Ready and Have a Strong Plan and Pathway to Economic Security

- Teachers revise their curriculum to ensure skills/content are aligned to priority skills/criteria and content
- Diploma program teachers (grades 11 & 12) review and analyze the historical IB/DP/college and career preparatory curriculum;
- K-12 student and family resources in multiple languages, and a targeted high school college and career advising pilot.
- College & Career Guidance meet w/ students in 11 & 12 to develop individualized College Match plans
- Middle school college and career counseling and advising programs
- Acceleration of postsecondary success with early college credits and credentials of value
- Grades 9-12 participate in college (CUNY, SUNY & private) courses and tours based on College & Career plans and College Match.
- Building high quality college and career pathways programs with meaningful work experiences from internships and apprenticeships.

All Students Have a High-Quality Academic Experience

- In school Metamorphosis Coaching in 16 schools to enhance Tier 1 instruction
- In school strategic planning, professional learning and/or coaching support in 14 schools from the DIstrict 15 Math instructional specialist
- Developing Big Ideas in Math Professional Learning Series 10 sessions -126 teachers participated in professional learning across the district.

Data:

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• Observations: classrooms implementing centers and small group instruction during Tier 1 that incorporate concrete manipulatives and opportunities to make connections to the mathematical representations and abstract ideas.

Redesign the System to be More Inclusive and Responsive for Parents and Families

Interpretation in different languages was offered during all parent/family workshops and monthly townhalls

All flyers and Powerpoints were translated into different languages.

ESSA Designation Updates

15K136	Newly designated as CSI
15K015	Remaining CSI as they met the cutoff, but did not demonstrate growth over the original data
15K676	Moved from CSI to TSI with a focus on Students With Disabilities
15K497	Remaining TSI - Focus is now Middle School Black students. Previously the focus was for both Middle School Black students as well as Middle School LatinX students. Middle School LatinX students are now LSI. High School Black and LatinX students were trending towards TSI, but are now LSI
15K032	Now LSI (Formerly "Good Standing") as they have been removed from the state's TSI status

ESSA= Every Student Succeeds Act

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CSI = Comprehensive Support and Improvement (Targets entire student population)

TSI = Targeted Support and Improvement (Targets specific accountability groups based on need)

LSI= Local Support and Improvement (Good standing schools receiving district-level support)

 - You will be applying to an individual CBO program operating at the site school (in some cases there may be more than one CBO program)
