


District Data Trends



4-Year Graduation

Almost 4 percentage point gain since Superintendent Ross has led the district, persevering through the COVID epidemic





+7 percentage points in SY 2021-22 (79% Sep to 86% Jun) As of Jun 2022, 40 of our 47 schools were above 80% YTD and 38% of students were **chronically absent**



SY2022-23 District Goals

GOAL 1

By June 2023, 100% of **BKNHS** will partner with industries to offer career pathways, authentic work-based learning experiences, and career-connected learning informed by student voice and choice, where students are ignited by rigorous, dynamic hands-on experiences in 21st century classrooms, that support them in the pursuit of their passions and goals.

By June 2023, all BKNHS will engage students in culturally responsive and sustaining, standardsaligned instruction, integrating highly impactful literacy and SEL practices, whereby 100% of our students will graduate, and improve their college readiness by 10%.

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GOAL

By June 2023, all BKNHS will create or expand their parent engagement plans to increase family involvement in our schools through collaboration and partnership with community stakeholders, empowering parents to be codecision-makers and best advocates for their children's learning needs in our reimagined communities.

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
GOAL

By June 2023, the **BKNHS** district chronic absenteeism rate will decrease by 5%, while overall attendance will increase by 5%, resulting from an effective and supportive attendance management system that involves school partners, structures for data monitoring and analysis, evaluation and assessment, and opportunities for meaningful stakeholder engagement.


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June 2022 ELA Regents district average - 67.8%	By June 2023, the average score for all our students will meet and possibly exceed the college and career proficiency rates on the ELA Regents.
June 2022 MATH Regents district average – 60.5%	By June 2023, the average score for all our students will meet and possibly exceed the college and career proficiency rates on the NYS Algebra 1 Regents exam.
51% of students are on track for college and career readiness	By June 2023, there will be a 5% increase of students on track for college and career readiness in ELA and Math based on end of term grades.
June 2022 district chronically absenteeism = 38%	By June 2023 district average YTD attendance will increase to 90% and the district chronic absenteeism will be decreased to 28%.
June 2022 School Survey - 63% of families are involved in school events	By June 2023, 83% of families will respond favorably that they are involved in schools as reported in the NYC school survey; specifically raising the 77% of our Multilingual Learners/ELLs and immigrant families who participate and indicate their needs are being met.







