

District Goals – SY2022-23



GOAL 1

GOAL 2

GOAL 3

By June 2023, all BKNHS will create or expand their parent engagement plans to increase family involvement in our schools through collaboration and partnership with community stakeholders, empowering parents to be co-decision-makers and best advocates for their children's learning needs in our reimagined communities.



GOAL 4


By June 2023, the BKNHS district chronic absenteeism rate will decrease by 5%, while overall attendance will increase by 5%, resulting from an effective and supportive attendance management system that involves school partners, structures for data monitoring and analysis, evaluation and assessment, and opportunities for meaningful stakeholder engagement.

4-Year Graduation as of June 2022


In spite of the COVID epidemic, Brooklyn North High Schools under Supt Ross's leadership have consistently supported more and more students to graduate. **As a result, as measured by NYSED accountability, ALL 47 of our schools have achieved "good standing" status!**



Attendance as of June 2022

40 of our 47 schools were above 80% YTD
 +7 percentage points (79% Sep to 86% Jun)
 38% of students were **chronically absent**


As of 3/31/23, ALL 47 schools are above 80%!







- Collaboration with leading experts – literacy (Dr. Donyall Dickey, Kylene Beers), differentiated instruction (Dr. Carol Tomlinson & Dr. Krista Doubet), math (DCI), CRSE practices (Dr. Gholdy Muhammad)
- Leveraging experts in the district – teacher intervisitations, campus collaboration, master teachers
- Attendance & Chronic Absenteeism – outreach to at-risk students, support schools to implement proven strategies such as Success Mentors

Based on based on creativity, feasibility, sustainability, and teamwork, 3 teams were selected to advance to the finals in Aspen in June.






