





College & Career Readiness

Priority Need: Increase the percentage of students with access to courses to support college & career readiness.


Baseline Data: The CCR average metric for the Class of 2024 for BKNHS was 60%.

DCEP Goal: By June 2025, there will be a 6.5 point increase in all students enrolled in all advanced course offerings from 63.5% to 70%.



Supt. Ross SAT/PSAT/AP Participation 2020-2024


Increased participation in SAT Suite of Assessments in the Class of 2023 & 2024

AP students have increased over the past three years








DCEP Priority 4: Advanced Placement & BKNHS Increase in Latinx & multi-race student participation





Almost all student groups increased in exams taken & qualifying scores achieved


AP 2024 Performance by Race/Ethnicity- All Schools


