




Celebrating Wit and Wisdom at P.S. 321

More Context: Grade 5 Module 2: Word Play

Students examine how authors use wordplay to engage audiences, create humor, and express themes.

Core Text: The Phantom Tollbooth by Norton Juster introduces students to clever puns and imaginative storytelling.

Art Integration: Surrealist paintings (The Persistence of Memory by Salvador Dalí and Time Transfixed by René Magritte) encourage discussions on artistic and literary creativity.

Literary Analysis: Students study narrative structure, character development, and humor through reading, writing, and discussions.

Final Task: Students write a narrative expanding on a scene from the text, demonstrating their understanding of wordplay and themes.

Key Skills: Analyzing character dialogue and plot, Crafting descriptive short narratives, Adapting speech for specific audiences




About the Film


