Common Grading Policy

Our goals:

- 1. Create a district wide grading policy that all teachers are expected to follow to ensure equitable, research and evidence based grading and assessment practices.
- 2. Policy should be aligned to standards-based grading to support best practices in the classroom for both teachers and students' success.

The purpose of grades are:

- To successfully provide feedback to students to improve their learning.
- To document students' progress on standards, skills and content.
- To inform teachers' instructional decisions.

District Professional Development Plans

- District-wide professional development expectations are currently being developed for school leaders and will focus on,
 - Improving student outcomes
 - Strengthening pedagogical practices

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Some key components:

- □ Instructional Focus should be aligned to CEP goals
- □ Research and Evidence based
- □ Based on Student data and assessment
- □ Differentiation / Small group instruction
- □ Groups that are being targeted for support
- □ Teacher leadership opportunities
- Resources and partnerships should be aligned to
 CEP goals and priorities
- Observational feedback is aligned to CEP goals and instructional focus
- Sharing of professional development plan and priorities to families and students
- □ Opportunities for feedback and reflection
- □ Use of protocols. Like data, student work analysis, consultancy etc.
- □ Inquiry cycles of learning
- Job embedded coaching
- PD committee; shared decision making and planning
- □ Time for Curriculum Planning and revision
- □ Assessment plan/pacing calendar

Opening of 3k & Pre-K Applications

Parents can begin submitting applications for their child to enroll in <u>3-K</u> or <u>pre-K</u> for the 2023–24 school year on January 25. Families who have signed up for the admissions mailing list or have created a MySchools Account will be notified once the application is open via an email from <u>noreply@schools.nyc.gov</u>. Families can apply online on <u>MySchools.nyc</u>, over the phone by calling (718) 935-2009, and in-person at a <u>Family Welcome Center</u>.

- Families must submit their applications for 3-K and pre-K by March 10.
- Families can attend these upcoming elementary admissions virtual events to learn more about the 3-K and pre-K admissions applications process; sessions will be held from 6:00–7:00 p.m. on January 26, from 2:00–3:00 p.m. on February 1, and/or from 6:00–7:00 p.m. on February 15. You may share this flyer (available in all DOE languages) with families. Interpretation services are available at the events.
