#### President's Report - Camille Casaretti, CEC15 President

Welcome to the CEC15 October Calendar Meeting and thank you for taking the time to join us this evening. I am Camille Casaretti, President of CEC15. It's hard to believe we are getting close to the end of our second month of this school year.

**November is Family Empowerment Month** and the DOE will be hosting trainings, offering resources, and various supports designed so that families and school staff can better partner to support their children. Stay tuned for lots of family events and keep checking the DOE website for more information.

While you're there, you should check out the <u>School Reopening 2020–21 Family Guide</u> which provides some information on what that **teaching and learning** will look like this school year. You will find universal expectations for how our schools will support every single student every single school day—whether they are participating in fully remote or blended learning.

A few parents have written expressing their concerns with the Chancellor's recent announcement that the opt in period for in person learning will only be offered once this year. We are going to have to learn more about this and why this decision was made. We do know that in person classes are much smaller than people realize. We;ve heard that it's been incredibly difficult to schedule classes in this way. Some classes have only three children in them, while some remote classes are bursting. We can discuss this later in more detail,

Your PA/PTA and SLT Elections should be happening this month. Running for a position in one of these leadership roles is a great opportunity to get involved at the school planning level.

Has your school already held their elections, and if not, is it scheduled? Please let the DOE know by responding to <u>this brief survey</u>.

Some parents have requested that students be able to use virtual backgrounds due to students feeling uncomfortable with the lack of privacy. All of the DOE platforms, Microsoft Teams, Zoom and Google Meets do allow for virtual backgrounds. We will share this information via email with all the links for how to change your background.

Over the weekend, I co-wrote a letter with the ECC that was sent to Gov. Cuomo to ask for an increase in the State Ed Budget. It was copied to various elected State officials from the Education Committee including Mayor DeBlasio and Chancellor Carranza. Please continue to call your elected leaders to insist that more funding be offered to our public schools.

A few disturbing and upsetting things have happened to a people that we know in other Districts: One of our very respected and active cec leaders had a death in his family due to **gun violence**. Two citywide leaders were **impersonated** during a public meeting that was streamed live on youtube. The comments made were very hurtful and damaging. SOme viewers knew immediately that it was a hoax and reported it but the impersonators were not found. And in a school in District 13 one child who was new to the school received a call from someone impersonating the Principal and gave the impersonator private information. They were later being harassed by email and sent prornographic images. These kinds of impersonations are actually a misdemeanor, please notify us if you believe a similar situation is taking place.
