Upcoming data consultation on Tuesday, September 20, 2022

District 15 Data Summary is in draft form for CEC 15 to review, the data has not, yet been published. It was offered in advance so that CEC 15 can discuss additional requests. This document includes citywide and district specific data on enrollment trends, retention, available seats, capacity, demographic and student population information and programmatic offerings in the district. This information should be used to drive planning conversations, district needs and priorities for the 2022-2023 school year.

Enrollment has asked that each member fill out a brief survey, which will help inform the focus of the conversation and allow District Planning to prepare answers to specific questions.

As CEC 15 reviews the data summary, consider the following in thinking about district needs:

- Do all students in the district have access to quality schools and programs that meet their needs?
  - Are there opportunities to expand offerings to drive demand in schools and programs?
  - o Does access vary by neighborhood or demographic?
  - What opportunities exist to increase diversity and integration across the district?
- Are all schools able to offer robust, sustainable programming?
  - Are there notable enrollment trends?
  - Are there specific schools with concerning declining enrollment or positive enrollment growth?
- Are DOE buildings being used efficiently to meet student needs?
  - o Is there overcrowding or available space that can be used to address district needs?
- In light of the impact of COVID-19, have new district needs emerged, and are any existing needs now more pressing?

Camille Casaretti, President reports on liaised schools:

P.S. 24 - Foyers, doors on the side and back exits are rotting. The building conditions are a safety hazard.

The school was supposed to get two new kitchenettes over the summer, and that did not happen. The school yard is in even worse shape. DSF made repairs, but the SCA made it worse. Areas under the turf were destroyed, there are a lot of potholes. Currently there are scaffolds up for repairs on the roof which will result in a delay to fix these issues until after the scaffolds are removed. The school only has 9 children enrolled in the new G&T class.

**Brooklyn High School for the Arts** - The Parent Coordinator and Assistant Principal both left. Working on finding the best candidates. The school has no issues with the budget. They have almost 1000 students enrolled. They are satisfied with their arts funding.

BHS - Will be meeting with the Principal on Wed 9/14. They did not have a nurse last week.

**M.S. 447** - Needs a new building, the building that the school is housed in was never meant to be a school. Working with CB2 Education Chair to get the parking lot repaved so that they can use it as a recess yard.

JosephAlexander reports on liaised schools:

**K280** - The pre-k classrooms are running over ratio (safety concerns, 2 above contractual size, however there are others that are very small and some classrooms unused)

15K442 - needs more space

News from Supt. Alvarez - Transformer fire at PS 136, power will be restored by morning.

4. Discussion on Support for School Based Health Centers - Camille Casaretti, President

<u>History</u> - SUNY Downstate has a 5 year contract to host the School Based Health Centers which expired at the end of July. The schools that lost clinics are: P.S. 38, BHS, BNS/BCS, MS51. SBHCs are a vitally important part of our healthcare system. Assemblyman Richard N. Gottfried has been working with the New York School Based Health Alliance to resolve this issue. Part of the problem

seems to be that by an error, in this year's state budget, the State Senate neglected to match the Assembly's allocation of funds to SBHCs. Conversations with our State Senators have led CEC 15 to believe they are trying to resolve this. At the same time, the State Health Department is working to find support for the SUNY Downstate-sponsored SBHCs although they have already moved much of their furniture and equipment out of the schools.

## What CEC15 did so far

Survey to families - CEC 15 received more than 200 responses all supporting the idea to keep the clinics open.

Meeting with elected officials - multiple calls and emails have been dispatched to try to get more funding from the Senate.

Meeting with parents from the schools to combine efforts.

The D19 CEC President, who also had a disruption with Downstate has a connection with NY Health & Hospital and is trying to find out if they would be willing to take over these spaces.

Outreach to the Mayor's office.

Meeting with SBHC staff.

Supt. Alvarez has been working with NYU Langone to see if they would take over.

CEC 15 also sent Certificates of Appreciation to all the staff members of the SBHC.

### **Next Steps**

Trying to schedule a meeting with the senate health committee chair.

Supt. Alvarez is in conversation with NYU Langone and they are communicating that they have capacity to take over the clinics. They are looking at Jan 2023 to solidify details.

D19 had a Health and Hospital Meeting today.

In the meantime, SUNY is providing doctors that are accessible to students and will visit the schools for appointments until we get this resolved.

Also, nurses will be posted in every school building.

Per SGO Linda Perez: If the CEC wants to provide incentive awards to students, that would have to be officially documented as a sanctioned incentive program (schools have done movie theater vouchers).
