

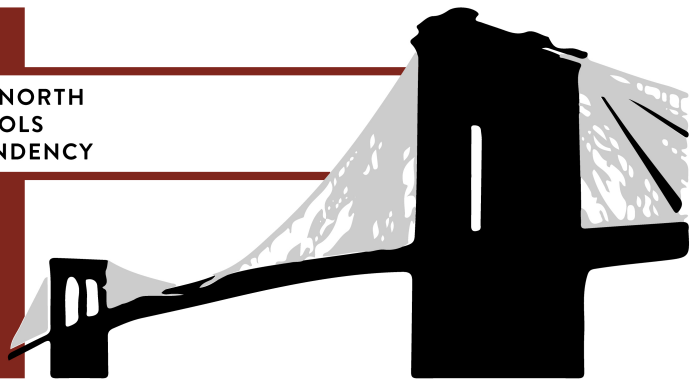

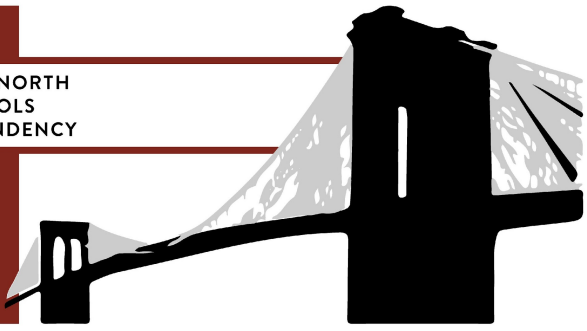

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District Goals for SY 2022-23

GOAL 1

By June 2023, 100% of BKNHS will partner with industries to offer career pathways, authentic work-based learning experiences, and career-connected learning informed by student voice and choice, where students are ignited by rigorous, dynamic hands-on experiences in 21st century classrooms, that support them in the pursuit of their passions and goals.

GOAL 2

By June 2023, all BKNHS will engage students in culturally responsive and sustaining, standards-aligned instruction, integrating highly impactful literacy and SEL practices, whereby 100% of our students will graduate, and improve their college readiness by 10%.

GOAL 3

By June 2023, all BKNHS will create or expand their parent engagement plans to increase family involvement in our schools through collaboration and partnership with community stakeholders, empowering parents to be co-decision-makers and best advocates for their children's learning needs in our reimagined communities.

GOAL 4

By June 2023, the BKNHS district chronic absenteeism rate will decrease by 5%, while overall attendance will increase by 5%, resulting from an effective and supportive attendance management system that involves school partners, structures for data monitoring and analysis, evaluation and assessment, and opportunities for meaningful stakeholder engagement.

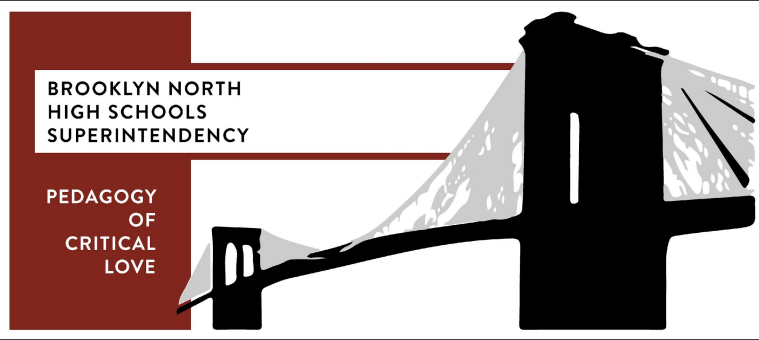

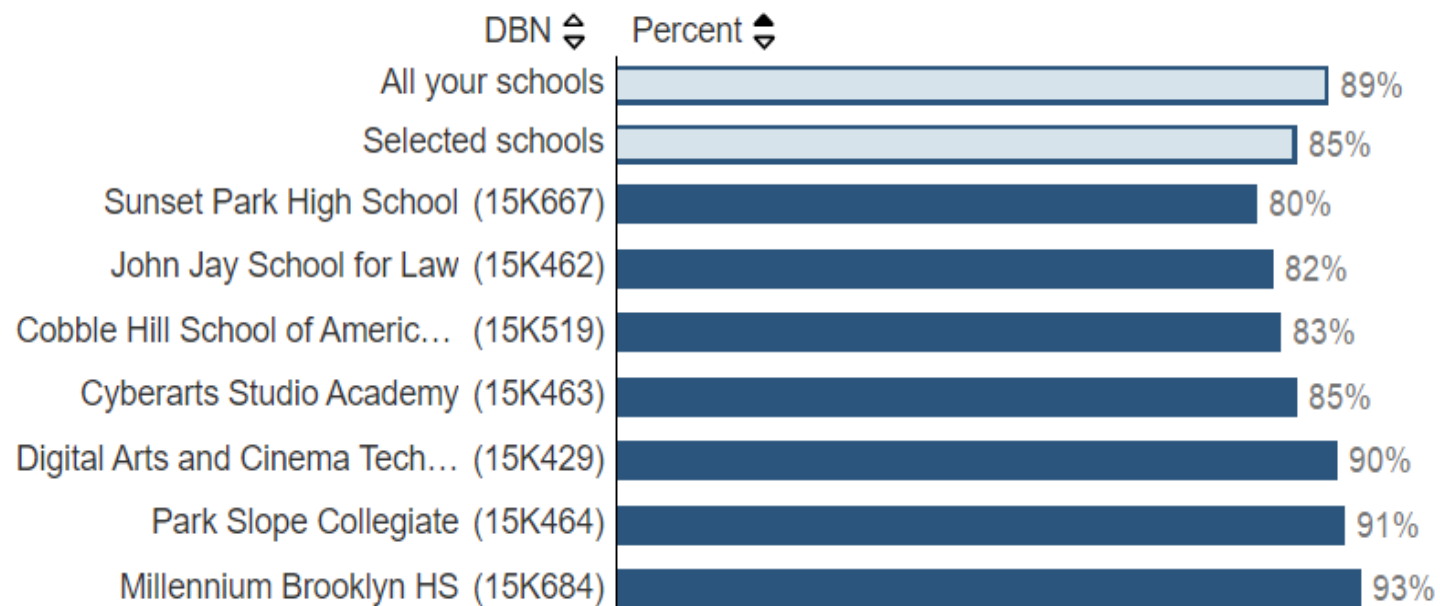
District 15 YTD Attendance

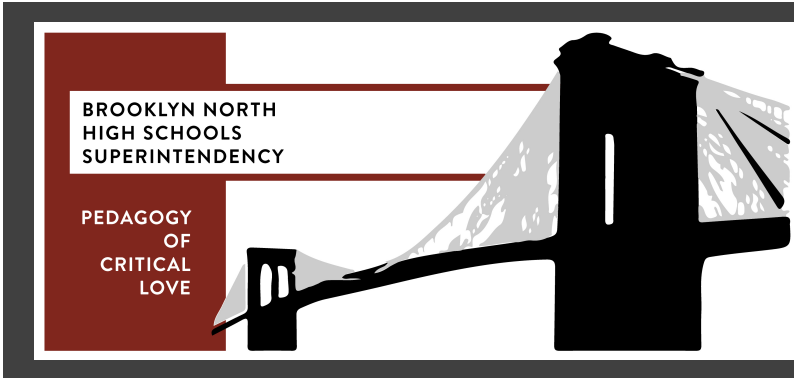
YTD Averages as of 11/22/2022

A STRONG PLAN:

PSAT and SAT School Day

- SAT School Day administration will be centrally funded for all juniors, and the PSAT 10 will be centrally funded for all sophomores. For more information > <https://www.schools.nyc.gov/learning/testing/college-entrance-exams/sat-school-day>

CUNY-DOE Citywide Initiatives

- CUNY fee waivers are made available to all eligible low-income students applying to CUNY schools. Contact your school college counselor for more information.
- [College and Career Bridge for All](#): Summer Melt intervention program that leverages a near-peer model to support seniors as they navigate the post-secondary planning and transition processing – including completing college applications, financial aid forms, and enrollment steps.
- [Next Steps Advising](#): Provides direct support to students seeking assistance with postsecondary planning and applications. DOE school counselors, social workers, and teachers are available Monday - Friday from 4:30pm - 8:30pm, and Saturday & Sunday from 10am-2pm.



Post-Secondary Preparedness

ON A PATH:

Future Ready NYC (FRNYC)

- 33 schools in implementation and 31 schools in planning phase
- Support and funding to develop labor market-aligned pathways in education, health, technology, business/ entrepreneurship, finance; and include five key elements: career connected instruction, digital and financial literacy, early college credit and credentials, paid work-based learning experiences and 1:1 college and career advisement.

Career Readiness & Modern Youth Apprenticeship (CRMYA)

- 58 participating schools – including A-Tech in D14
- Robust professional development for 9th and 10th grade teachers with 3-year, paid apprenticeship opportunities in business, finance and tech for selected students.
- Intentional integration of career-connected learning as a school-wide strategy with a focus on universal career readiness in 9th and 10th grade and apprenticeships for students selected by employers starting in junior year.

Career and Technical Education Schools & Programs

- NYCDOE's [CTE portfolio](#) includes 297 programs in 131 schools
- NYSED certified CTE programs (63% of portfolio) offer a minimum of 7 instructional credits delivered by a CTE licensed teacher; and implementation of employer and higher-ed validated curriculum and credentialing
- Access to 54 hours of [work-based learning experiences](#), sustained engagement with employer and higher education partners and implementation of a three-part technical assessment.

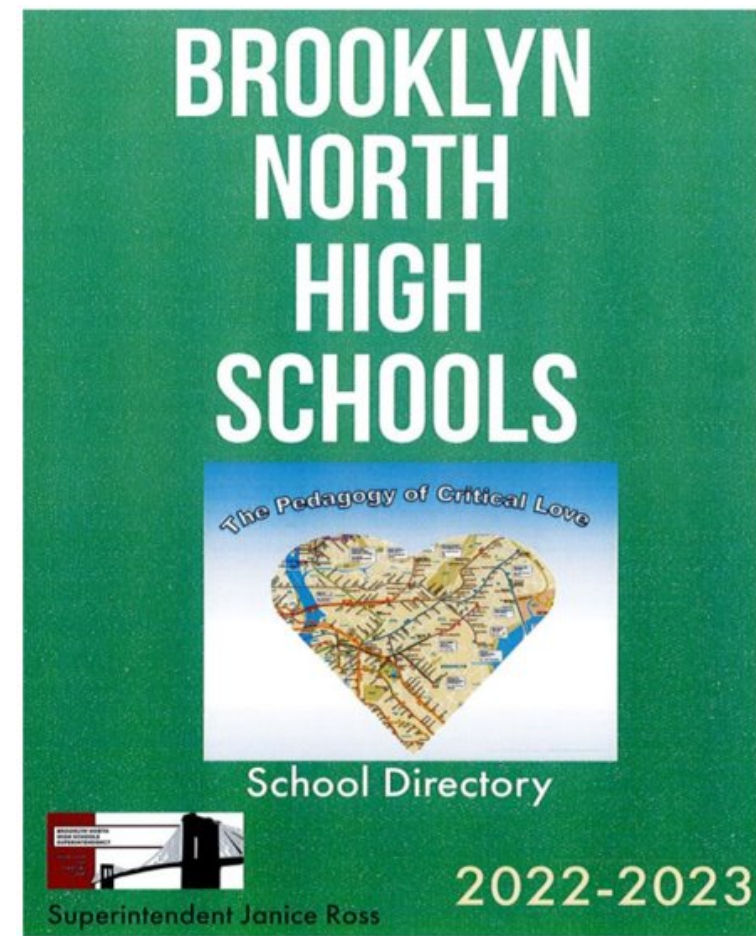


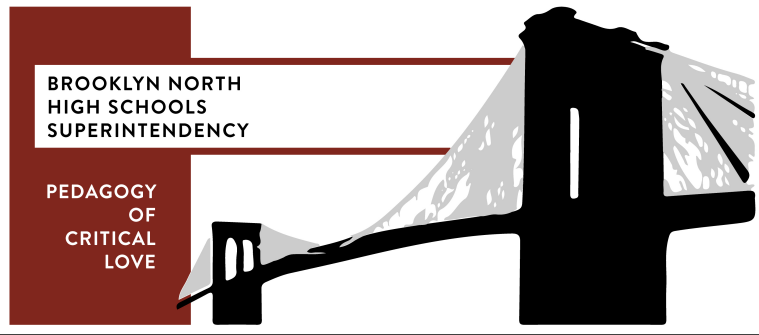
