Health Clinic Update from Office of Shool Health (OSH)

- SUNY Downstate closed five sites in District 15; PS146, MS/HS 497, MS 51, and PS 38
- In the meantime, school nurses will be placed in all of the buildings affected starting in September.
- All 5 campuses that had SUNY SBHCs will have full time nurses supported by OSH physicians this school year.
- Simultaneously, we are actively seeking a new sponsor for the SBHC spaces that SUNY occupied and have engaged providers in the early stages of this process to gauge interest and viability.
- Once a new sponsor is identified, the State oversees the process from there; we anticipate early 2023 to have sponsors in place.
- We will keep you apprised of any developments or news.

- The Office of School Health includes more than 70 board certified pediatricians.
- These physicians visit their assigned schools depending on the clinical need sometimes one or twice a month to care for students in-person in partnership with the school nurse.
- School physicians manage and uncover health issues that can negatively impact safety, attendance, and academic success.
- For example, our school physicians focus on helping students manage chronic medical conditions such as asthma and diabetes.
- When they are not on-site in schools, our school physicians have office hours when they are calling the students' primary care doctors to inform them of health updates or concerns that happen during the school day that need their attention.
- They talk with parents and coordinate with other agencies across the city to connect students to the resources they need.
- When students have incomplete or no medical history on file, school physicians are required to serve as their primary care doctor of record. They conduct more than 20,000 medical sessions annually.
- The physician assigned to the 5 buildings for the fall is Dr. Remedios Caparas.

COVID HEALTH POLICIES & PROCEDURES

<u>Vaccination Requirements:</u> Vaccination is still required for visitors entering school buildings, DOE employees, individuals who work in DOE building and for high-risk PSAL sports and extracurricular activities. **Visitors must show proof of at least 1 dose of the Covid-19 vaccine to enter a DOE building.**

<u>Daily Screener:</u> No longer required to enter school buildings.

<u>Isolate if COVID-19 Positive:</u> Students and staff testing positive must isolate for 5 days and wear a mask until day 10 after symptoms onset or positive test, whichever is earlier.

Masking: Face coverings are strongly recommended when indoors, but not required.

Ventilation: 160K+ air purifiers distributed to schools -at least 2 per class

<u>Rapid Testing:</u> Schools are distributing free, take-home COVID-19 test kids to any students or staff who exhibit COVID-like symptoms or have been in a class where a positive case has been identified.
