This is also our final Calendar Meeting of the 2023-24 school year. I want to briefly reflect on the work that this council has done. We have passed several resolutions:

- CEC15 Supported the MS 447 Name Change
- CEC15 Support Students with Personal Information Compromised in June 2023 Data Breach.
- CEC15 Asked the NYSED to Adjust Interpretation of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act
- CEC15 Opposed the 60-day Limitation on Shelter Stays for Families of Public School Students
- CEC15 Urged the DOE to implement the proposals of the Class Size Working Group and comply with the New Class Size Law
- CEC15 Support of Sustaining Key Education Programs Funded with Expiring Federal COVID-19 Relief
- CEC15 Urged the Implementation of Daylighting Provisions at Intersections throughout Community School District 15
- CEC15 Signed on to a Memorandum of Opposition to A1799/S2967 establishing the Citywide Leadership Team in New York City
- And Signed on to a Call to Sustain the Removal of District Priority in Manhattan
- And CEC15 worked for three months in collaboration with families on a Resolution to Prevent and Respond to Hate Speech

I want to thank my fellow council members for their contributions, their collaboration, and cooperation. They have challenged me to rise to their expectations of the office of CEC15 president.
