Hello Disciples!

On my first Sunday with you, in late November, our worship focused on the Advent theme of Hope. Hope is always a good place to start preparing the way for the celebration of the coming Christ child. Hope is always a good place to stand if you want to see new possibilities. This is especially true for this church, as you continue to move through a long period of transition from one settled pastor to the next.

I know how the feeling of hopefulness can often seem elusive, transitory. And I know how faithful and dedicated the pastoral search team continues to be in spite of frustration and disappointments. I know folks were hoping that by now you would be close to hiring just the right pastor. Hoping that by now you would all have a clear idea of where you were headed next.

I thought of this as I was reading Matthew's account of the transfiguration of Jesus, (17:1-8) a remarkable transition point in the Gospel. Jesus had taken along three of his Disciples – Peter, James and John to pray on the top of a nearby mountain. Surely, none of them had a clear idea about where they might be headed next.

The Disciples had been traveling with Jesus for quite a while, getting to know him well. But they were just beginning to learn what it meant to follow him. They didn't yet have a clear vision of God's future for themselves or for their community.

You might think that after the transfiguration, that the Disciples might have found hope rising, and possibility opening. You might think that after this vision of light and glory, they might have found a sense of clarity and purpose. But instead, they ended up crouched on the ground and filled with fear.

In 2014, Disciples of Christ from Oregon and SW Idaho gathered together in Hood River, Oregon to form a new regional church. During our three worship experiences, we used water brought from the rivers that ran through our cities and towns where we had congregations and combined the waters in different ways and then gave people jars of "changed" water to take home. We formed 5 districts, each of them named for a different river system in our geography.

As we did 8 years ago at our beginning as a regional church, at our 2022 Regional Assembly we will continue to lean into the image of a flowing river moving us into an unknown future beyond the next turn, beyond our current sight line.
