#### Family Fun Night- Celebrating Moms





The Board Members met in the Fireside Room, Monday, April 8th at 6:30 PM.

#### Facility Report:

Allan reported that the church property could use an additional two yards of wood chips. He performed these services: sprayed for ants, placed weed and feed on front yard, replaced the motion

sensor light in pantry and replaced security lights in multipurpose room.

#### Deacons' Report:

Karen suggested obtaining members emergency contact information in case it is needed when something unexpected occurs. The information will be kept confidential. She will develop a form.

#### **CWF Report:**

The Easter egg hunt was successful. Pray shawls will be made for high school graduates instead of quilts.

#### Pastor's Report:

The Pastor reported that April 24th is Office Administrator's Day. The Pastor is planning to provide flowers for Jana.

Family Fun Night on April 14th will involve assembling kits for refugees.

He announced that there will be another C.A.S.T. for kids fishing event at Kyllo reservoir on May 18th. He asked it the church would like to be a sponsor. After some discussion, Allan made a motion to sponsor a CAST for kids at Kyllo Reservoir at the amount of \$1000. Karen seconded the motion. Board Approved.

#### Chairperson's Report:

Steve raised the issue of rents for the coming year. Due to the increases in electric rates, the following raises will be made for the next year: Rental for "Sunshine Pre-school" will increase 10% monthly with full monthly rent in September and May and rent for "Not Just Cheesecake" will be raised to \$800 per month with a 12-month contract with no proration.

The church's Oktoberfest truck will be set up for sale to the Mt Angel Oktoberfest committee. Chuck Koenig said that he would pick up the truck at the Annen's and bring it to the Church's parking lot. Chuck offered to take over the mowing of church property during this growing season. Verlene made a motion for Chuck and his grandson, C.W. to mow the church property during the season at the cost of \$210.00 per month. Allan seconded the motion. Board approved.


