Here is the church policy that continues to be in place in regard to cases of Covid and possible exposure as well as illness in general. This policy has been what we have been using since the start as well as what other churches, the region, and other organizations are using as well.

If we are notified by a member who was at a gathering or event or worship that they have tested positive for Covid in the days that follow. We send out an email to the church community notifying people that we had a member who tested positive for Covid and attended whatever particular event.

We encourage everyone who was at that event to watch for

We encourage everyone who was at that event to watch for symptoms and fever and if they start showing any of these to test.

It has never been our policy, nor is it elsewhere, to name the individual who tested positive. In general, with illness our policy continues to be if you are running a fever, showing symptoms, or sick please stay home and let Pastor Eric, the Church office, or the Elders know if there is anything we can do or drop off for you.

Thank you for sharing your children with us.



#### Disciples Special Offering: Christmas Offering







# Splinters from the Board

First Christian Church of Silverton, Oregon Board Meeting Minutes. November 11, 2024

The meeting began with a prayer led by Steve Reid

#### Board Secretary - Jolene Smoot:

 Previous Minutes - Jolene asked if there were any changes to the October 14, 2024, minutes. Lynn Koenig made a motion to approve the minutes, Verlene Beard seconded the motion. Motion passed.

#### Special Presenter:

Spaghetti Feed - Gail Frassenei, presented an idea for offering a spaghetti dinner, open to the
community, on the 5th Saturday of the month, which would average four times a year. Gail's goal is to
get her generation and the younger generation more involved in these types of activities.
Gail and Beth would be the organizers of the dinner. The menu would consist of spaghetti, a choice of
meat sauce or non-meat sauce, bread, salad and dessert. To keep it simple, the menu will stay the
same and not change. A basket can be placed at the end of the table for anyone who would like to
leave a donation.

It was decided that the first spaghetti dinner will be held on March 29, 2025. The next three will be May 31, August 30 and November is to be determined since it is so close to Thanksgiving. The event will be advertised in the newsletter, on Facebook, in Silverton Connection, and in Our Town.

Regarding food inspection and food licenses requirements, Gail will work with Lynn Koenig.

Lynn made a motion to approve having a spaghetti dinner on the 5<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the month. Karen Brock seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Rotary Club Ministry – Eric mentioned that Dixon Bledsoe from the Rotary Club Ministry asked if he could use the multi-purpose room the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday of each month. The ministry will be offering free shoes for all ages and it will be open to the community. The first event would be held this Friday, November 15 and then again on December 20<sup>th</sup>, and from then on, it will be held the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday of the month. The event will take place from 1:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. The ministry has offered to donate \$200 every month to the church for this service.

It was mentioned that we could use one of our tables in the multi-purpose room and anyone that wanted to donate shoes could leave them for the ministry to add to their current supply. If there happens to be a conflict with using the room on Friday, such as a funeral, etc. Dixon is more than willing to work with us as needed. Eric stated the elders and the exec team signed off on Dixon's request and he is now bringing it to the board for their approval. Karen Brock made a motion to approve the ministry to use the multi-purpose room the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday of the month beginning this November 15<sup>th</sup>. Verlene Beard seconded the motion. The motion was approved.
