From The Pastor: General Assembly

General Assembly is the gathering of our denomination that takes place now every three years. Thousands and thousands and thousands of Disciples from congregations all over the United States and Canada and the world gather to worship together, to serve together, to stand together, to grow together, and to love together as part of the body of Christ.

We gathered this past July in Memphis, Tennessee. A place with humidity and thunderstorms, a place of blue suede shoes, a place with amazing barbecue, a place where soul music just gives life to dry bones, a place of sorrow and hope where we are reminded of the work and sacrifice of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr and so many others, reminded that work of justice, of civil rights, of striving toward the beloved community, that dream of the “kin”dom of God, still requires our hearts, our minds, our hands, and our lives.

We were inspired and moved by powerful worship. We had amazing music in all kinds of different styles and from all kinds of cultures. We were encouraged and challenged by incredible speakers like Rev. Dr. Bernice King (daughter of Rev. Dr. MLK Jr), Rev. Brian Kirk, Rev. April Lewton, Rev. Dr. Stephen Cady, Rev. Terri Hord Owens, Rev Dr. Sharon Watkins, Rev. Dr. Dick Hamm, and Rev. John Humpert, calling us forward and beyond as Disciples. Calling us to be people of justice and compassion, a people who dare to arise to the power that God has given us to transform this world, to love one another, to stand with those who the world overlooks and puts down, to gather round Christ’s tables of hope and grace, and to never stop striving for dream of the “kin”dom of God. To remember as our hispanic ministries have taught us “Somos Uno” - “We are one”, we are tied together as part of one body in a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world.

General Assembly reminds us that we are not alone. It encourages us to keep at the work of love. It connects us with old friends and helps us make new friends too. It inspires us and challenges us and reminds us who and whose we are and the work to which we have been called together to do and be in this world. It reminds us that we have the power to make change, the call to stand together in a world that calls us to look out only for ourselves, to remember that we are tied together in “a single garment of destiny” working for the wholeness and healing and justice of each other.

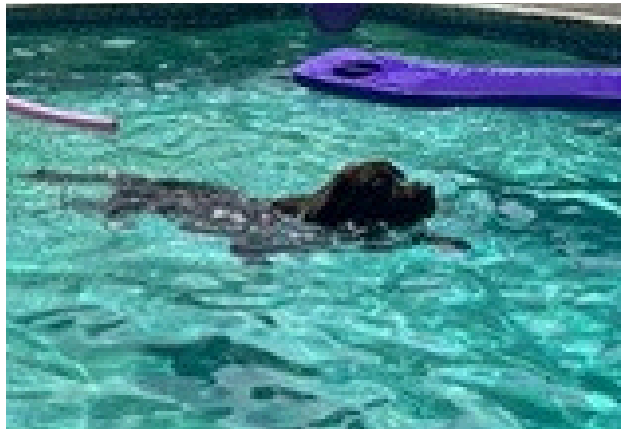


July in Review

- ~Respect the space– Treat the lock-in space with respect and avoid damaging property.
- ~No Electronics– (Cell Phones, Laptops, Computers, Headphones, etc.) Youth leaders and chaperones will have phones on at all times if parents need to be contacted.
- ~No Weapons, Drugs, or Alcohol
- ~Participation is expected– Participants should be involved in group activities, No bad attitudes.
