# From The Pastor Continued:










# August in Review









**Ecumenical Blessing of the Backpacks** 

We had a wonderful Ecumenical Blessing of the Backpacks Service this past Sunday as 120 plus people gathered as Methodists, Lutherans, and Disciples to unite around our students, teachers, staff, and schools. We enjoyed beautiful music from all three of our churches. We had a powerful communion led by Rev. Laura from the Methodists and the youth from all three churches under the supervision of Jonathon and Brogan did a great job deaconing. Rev. Leah from Immanuel Lutheran brought us a moving message reminding us all to be the beloved community together. We gave out mini prayer shawls- made by the prayer shawl teams at Silverton FCC and Immanuel Lutheran. Karen Brock and others put together an amazing coffee time and we raised \$744.00 for Silverton Middle School and High School and collected school supplies for our Silverton Elementary Schools.







The youth had a busy month of August and have been hard at work. They had their Community Yard Sale and thirteen of our youth showed up to help out. Over the three days we took in over \$2,600. We could not have done this without the support of the community, our fellow church members, and the church itself. Thank you to everyone who donated items and those that showed up over the weekend to say hi and shop. The remaining items were donated to our community and these ministries were so grateful for your donations. This event was so successful, the youth are considering if this will be an annual youth fundraiser/mission in the coming years.

The following weekend we had the Annual Youth Lock-In. We started the day with Prayer and Breakfast, then we headed to Wings & Waves Waterpark where the kids played for hours and got some great bonding moments in. After a picnic in the cutest little park and returning to the church in the early afternoon, we relaxed with a discussion about tithing, fundraising, and awarded our winner of the fundraising competition his prize of getting to cut Jonathon's hair. After we all had a good laugh, the youth started working on their bottle drop fundraiser. The kids bagged and stickered over 30 bags of cans and worked together as a group to get the job done. ### **Board Meeting Minutes, August 11, 2025**

**Treasures Report** – Erin Stone presented the report and discussed it with the group. Rent is down due to no rent from Sunshine school. It was reported we reached out to the school; however, we haven't had any response to date. We will continue trying.

Giving/Income Report - The Board discussed the report as presented by Verlene Beard.

### Facilities Report - Allan Graves

- Stove top pilots were replaced to prevent gas leaks
- Installed door closer in room 3 and replaced MPR doorstops
- The faulty condenser was replaced on the kitchen refrigerator.
- Allan and Sheila painted the education wing double doors, trimmed shrubs and removed a dead shrub.
- There was a recommendation to bring the refrigerator and freezer out annually for maintenance, to help prevent or eliminate unforeseen issues.

**Elder's Report** - Pastor Eric shared they met for a special elder's gathering and voted to move forward with one service in the fall, with the exception of the 5th Sunday, it will continue to be a combined service format. Service will begin at 9:10 a.m. and directly following after a short coffee time, there will be a second hour of your choice to attend, with options such as: **Parents' Group** (Led by Parents), **Youth's Sunday School** (Led by Jonathon and Brogan), **Children's Sunday School** (Led by Pastor Eric), **Music with Gil** (once a month), **Adult Education** - Unpacking the Sermon (Led by an Elder). ### Extras-
