MISSION TRIP TO COSTA RICA - Cindy Baker

I saw the little flyer on the wall. “Come to Costa Rica!” My friend Jennifer was looking for others to go on a mission trip. I don’t think I was anywhere on her radar, being close to 30 years older than her. My initial thought about going was surprising. Maybe it would be my last chance to do something crazy! I never wanted to travel or serve in a mission field “out there!” This work would involve helping some mission partners who worked with women affected by extreme poverty, domestic abuse, and human trafficking.

Maybe Costa Rica wasn’t so far and maybe I could work hard and save enough to make it. I must have wanted to go or why would I look at my passport after so many years? Realizing it was 2 weeks short of expiring, I sent in the renewal fee. Thinking of poor Jennifer going on her own crossed my mind also. She had been very sick and I don’t think she was completely over it. I had heard of Beauty for Ashes. A couple of our young people had served with them before. I liked the name. I felt like I had come up out of my own ashes at one point in my life. Maybe I still am.

So, I made my decision. I would go to Costa Rica with a small group of women, twelve to be exact, and I would help where I could. Adventures in Missions had other opportunities too. Family trips and jobs for young people to help build schools and churches. I began making payments toward my trip on the Adventures in Missions website. Then I found out our church uses mission funds for this very purpose and they were going to pay half of my trip cost. So, when you give to Missions Funds, know that sometimes, you are helping people like me and others to learn and grow when it comes to sharing God’s word.

Before we arrived at the Mission House, which was built specifically for traveling missionaries, we realized we weren’t in Kansas anymore. Even the car dealerships were barred and barbed wired, but people on the street seemed friendly and the shops were busy. Traffic was wild and stop signs were mostly ignored. Motorcycles were the kings of the road and raced through traffic at high speeds. The sound pierced our ear drums for only a moment so there was no time to cry about it.

We pulled into the Mission House and saw it had an old mission style about it. The gate opened, the van entered and the gate clicked shut. Our rooms were upstairs and had all the conveniences of a nice hotel. A couple of the younger women took the upper bunks. Karla, our coordinator, called us together and gave us the low-down. We would be holding small evening “retreats” for the 30 to 40 women who were involved with Transforma, (the large local charity that worked directly with the women after we were gone.)

Our testimonies during the retreats would show these ladies that their stories mattered too. That they were not alone in feeling unsure about trusting other women with their words. When I told the story of the abuse that I suffered during my preteen years, one woman named Cathy could not contain herself and cried inconsolably, like I had when I shared it with my group earlier that week. I looked for her afterwards but she had left. I hoped I would see her again. Along with the retreats, we would be helping to set up the Graduation ceremony for the ladies who had completed the program, which included training in handling money, sewing, running a shop, massage, and even cutting hair. We did it with love and joy and we were so happy for our new friends.

MISSION TRIP TO COSTA RICA - Cindy Baker (Continued)

One of the highlights of our trip was being allowed to walk the streets of Barrio Sinai. A dangerous place where the drug lord who also seemed to own the land, allowed Vanessa, Transforma's leader, to bring our group through to visit some of the women's homes. It seemed he respected her and knew that she was helping his people learn to make more money. (More for him? I'm not sure) We would not be allowed to take pictures or talk to unrelated residents. People were watching.

Once there, we visited the new pre-school. A one room box with an exposed roof that included a bathroom and storage. We heard a large dog begin to bark and a man yelling just outside the door, as we began praying for the yet un-used school.

I think it was the first time I had heard the term, "Thunder praying." It felt amazing to plead our cause before the Lord. We prayed for the walls, the roof, the electrical outlets, the bathrooms, and anything else that could break down. We prayed for the children who would be attending and for their safety. All the while, not knowing what was happening just outside the thin walls of the building. I felt fearless. I knew God was with us and whatever was going to happen would be part of His plan.

When we left the school room, there was silence. And we were able to walk to several homes and visit some of the mothers and children there. Most were in tin shacks about 9 x 9 feet square. There was obviously an electrical system and bathroom facilities somewhere, but one of the buildings sat directly on mud with irregular damp and mossy steps that went from 8 inches tall to 18 inches tall. As we made our way down the uneven steps all we could do was use the rickety handrail and the ribbed metal siding as leverage. I'm certain we were all thinking about the difficulty of making our way back up. At the bottom, we saw a mom smiling with a mouthful of shiny metal crowns with her 3 boys standing protectively around her and a little girl's brown eyes peeping out of the darkness behind her from a tiny separate room. Taking this tour of 5 different homes in the barrio would later make sense. These were some of the graduates of the program.

This trip was not just about the women of Transforma or the support of Beauty for Ashes and the Mission House. It was about the travelers too. We learned to work together. Instead of running to others to gossip or seek back up, we learned to pray. To listen to what God wanted us to do. For instance, to apologize for being catty instead of hiding the issue. Each of us had our own stories. Some good, some dreadful and some, just beginning. In our debriefing sessions, I discovered one story that mirrored my own. A young woman from Montana, told of the rift between her and her mother.

The situations were somewhat different but I was able to share with her and tell her that what I truly wanted from my daughter was for her to let it go. My gambling addiction had caused me to neglect and abandon her. Did I need her to forgive me? Not necessarily. I just wanted her to say she was done being angry. We didn't have to talk or hug or cry. I just wanted her to be happy and to not think about the past. Hopefully, there will be healing in both our lives. Sharing our hopes and fears along with experiences was eye opening for many of us.

Graduation Day had arrived. I saw the lady with the silver teeth and her 4 kids. I saw the lady who sewed and the lady who ran the little shop out of her home. And I saw Cathy. Though we hadn't yet met, we hugged and shared some understanding looks and she told me to come back and visit. I spoke my little bits of Spanish, moved tables and chairs, made coffee, hugged people and helped cut the strings off the hot palm leaf tamales for the meal. I missed the awards ceremony, but I knew our friends were happy and I knew they had a future. I was proud of them and wanted to come and see them again someday. That day may never come but I will always have fond memories of each one of those women. And Cathy, I know you're gonna be alright.


