Note From Pastor Eric

The Monday of Holy Week began like any other Monday. Things were quiet and getting started, until Miss Kay, the lead teacher of the After School Program headed over to the education wing and turned on the heat. She had just sat down in her office, when this horrible buzzing, rattling, vibrating began in walls of the education wing, and it was especially loud in some of the classrooms. She came and got me, and we turned the heat off where she had turned it on and turned it down in all the rooms, but the sound and vibrating didn't stop.

Jana and I called Allan who told us to call our heating and air conditioning company, but they would not come. They said they thought it was electrical issue and to call an electrician and gave us the name of the company they recommended. We called and were told there would be a electrician soon, but hours rolled by and no electrician.

The buzzing and vibrating and rattling kept on going. Rotating in which rooms it was loudest. Teacher Teri and Marcus had now arrived and were inspecting one of Teri's preschool rooms when they smelled the odor of something overheating.

At this point I called the non-emergency dispatch line and explained the situation and asked if they could send someone to please come check this out. We tried to look at the fuse box, but the power system was not clearly labeled so they told me not to switch off the fuses.

Note From Pastor Eric Continued

As I was finishing the call, the police officer arrived and I took him back to the area. Kids and teachers and staff had been cleared out of that area. At the same time the police officer was looking at things the fire department arrived but had not been relayed by dispatch to go to the education wing and went to the sanctuary where no one was and began banging at the door.

Jonathon and Brogan just happened to be driving by and stopped and let them in so that no doors were broken down. They got redirected to education wing and the wonderful firemen came and inspected the area. They were able to figure out the correct fuse for power for the wing and got it turned off along with heaters to several rooms.

They identified the issue as a fire alarm sensor system that had been installed in our building in the 1960s when it was built. They had been told by us it had been deactivated but apparently all that had been done was someone had clipped the wire to the big bell in the hall, so that it would not ring. Something had set off one of these tiny little devices which look literally like a few screws sticking out of the wall. And then they had been unable to shut off as many had been painted over and others were covered by banners and posters. They had kept vibrating and going off thus overheating, by the time the firemen arrived they were over 100 degrees.

After getting the banners and things down from covering them and ensuring everything else was okay the firemen left telling us not to use that wing until an electrician had come and completely deactivated that systems and ensured everything was safe. I waited for the rest of the afternoon and still no electrician. Around 5:30pm I finally got a text letting me know he was coming as soon as he finished the job he was on in Salem. A little after 7pm the electrician finally was able to make it. He was a kind man who worked hard to cut the wire disconnecting the old system to the fuse box and he inspected the sensors and said we good to go.

All this made for a crazy, stressful, frightening Monday to begin our holy week. But it also was a reminder of God's love and the miracles all around us every day. If that had happened say the week before when no one was in there or if Teacher Teri and Marcus hadn't gone into the one room and smelled the overheating, if Jonathon and Brogan hadn't driven by, if the firemen hadn't come and figured out what it was and gotten the power to the wing turned off, if that electrician, even after a long day, had not still come all the way to us to deactivate the system and check everything, we probably would have had a fire and could have lost most of our building.

Life has crazy, stressful, scary, hard moments; but in the midst of them are so many glimpses of God and his love which is with us every step of the way. This past Monday, I saw the face of God in Miss Kay, Marcus, Teacher Teri, Jonathon, Brogan, Jana, the firemen, the electrician, Allan, and so many others. Throughout life and in all that it brings, let us look for the moments God reminds us He is with us; and let us work with God to be those moments in the lives of one another.

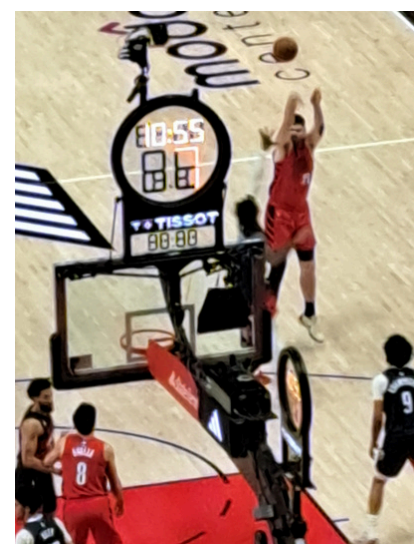

Ecumenical Palm Sunday Service

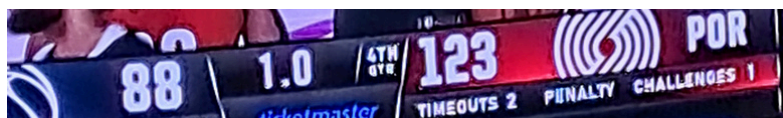
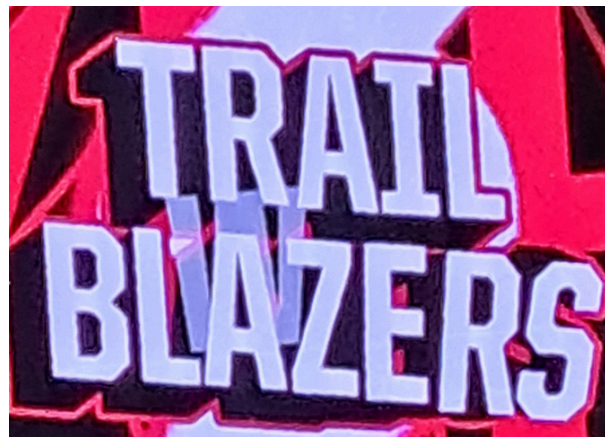
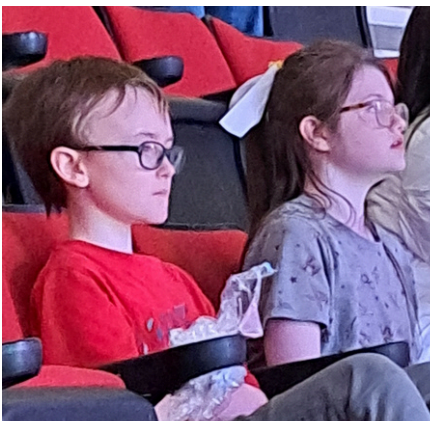

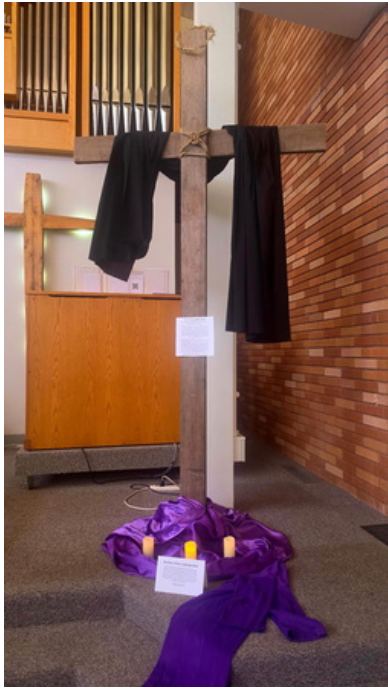
Maundy Thursday Dinner and Service
