To create a non-residential rehabilitation center offering trauma-informed therapy, life coaching, medical and mental health services, job training, housing resources, utilizing holistic healing practices in an effort to encourage long-term independence for survivors of sex trafficking.

The year in review

Challenges and Struggles in 2024

Despite a year filled with progress, Phoenix Arise Foundation faced several significant challenges in 2024. One of our most pressing difficulties was securing volunteers to support our efforts. With limited manpower, many of our team members took on multiple roles to ensure that our workshops, advocacy events, and direct survivor support programs continued. Additionally, we encountered barriers in finding available shelter space for survivors, which hindered our ability to provide immediate housing support for individuals in need. The overwhelming demand for these essential services often felt like there weren't enough hours in the day to meet all the needs of our beneficiaries. Another challenge was the lack of funding, which meant that all of our initiatives were carried out on a \$0 budget. This did not deter our commitment to the cause, but it did limit the scope of what we could accomplish. In the absence of external funding, we relied heavily on the dedication of our team, volunteers, and partners, and we are extremely grateful for their unwavering support.

Highlights and Successes in 2024

Despite these challenges, Phoenix Arise Foundation achieved significant milestones this year. Our workshops reached over 75 individuals, raising awareness about key issues such as sex trafficking, grooming, mental health, and bullying. We also provided direct support to four survivors, offering advocacy, donations, and empowerment programs. One of the most memorable moments of the year was assisting a survivor through childbirth, a powerful example of holistic support that goes beyond immediate physical needs and fosters long-term healing. Additionally, our collaboration with other organizations and stakeholders grew, strengthening our ability to advocate for change and provide resources. We participated in 12 events, including the Voices Rally and the Executive Sleep Out, and conducted 46 strategic meetings with key partners such as lawmakers, and trauma-informed care experts.

Looking Ahead to 2025

Future Rehabilitation Centre

In 2025, we will continue planning for a non-residential rehabilitation center designed to provide holistic and traditional care for survivors of trafficking. While the center will not open in 2025, we are actively working towards its future opening. The facility will offer trauma-informed therapy, life skills development, and long-term support to help survivors heal and regain independence. Our vision is to create a space where survivors can receive the care and resources they need to rebuild their lives and thrive.

Expanding Reach: In 2025,

we aim to significantly expand our outreach by delivering more targeted workshops to at-risk populations, including those vulnerable to trafficking, abuse, and homelessness. To achieve this, we will increase our partnerships with schools, community centers, shelters, and local businesses to provide education on recognizing signs of trafficking, personal safety, and available resources. We will engage with law enforcement, healthcare providers, and social service organizations to reach individuals who may not be aware of the support available to them. We will leverage digital platforms to offer online workshops and resources, ensuring that our reach extends beyond geographic limitations and reaches those in need, regardless of location. Through these expanded efforts, we aim to build stronger community awareness and prevention networks, empowering individuals with the knowledge and resources they need to protect themselves and others from trafficking.

Building Partnerships

In 2025, we aim to expand our network of collaborations by partnering with a broader range of organizations. This includes additional nonprofits and charities that focus on victim services, mental health, and housing for survivors.

We will work with educators and community organizations to raise awareness and educate the public on the signs of trafficking.

We aim to strengthen relationships with law enforcement agencies and policymakers

We are prioritizing new partnerships with healthcare providers, legal aid organizations, and corporations committed to social responsibility. These partnerships will strengthen our collective impact in the fight against sex trafficking.

Strengthen Advocacy

We will continue our advocacy efforts by pushing for the full passage of Bill 173, which recognizes intimate partner violence (IPV). Our efforts also include advocating for harsher sentencing for traffickers and the dismissal of charges for survivors who were trafficked.

We will work to secure increased government funding Increase research capacity and dedicate efforts to advocating for anti-sex trafficking initiatives.
