


SPRING CLEANING TIME April 19-26th

- The pressure reduction valves on all buildings were completed in 2023.
- The fence/gate project is underway. Rotten fences will be replaced, and all gates will be replaced with a new gate.

OTHER IMPORTANT ITEMS

Parking- Guest parking is very limited in most areas. Please use your garage for your vehicles. If a third family member has a vehicle, please be sure and park in a designated parking space. Remember to keep your garage door closed. This is a great safety feature and also a Germantown Ordinance.

Pet food- We want to remind everyone to not leave any pet food outside. With the construction nearby and the rodent issues likely to get worse, it is very important that all pet food is stored in **closed**, **sealed** container and no food left out. Unfortunately, bird feeders also attract rodents and squirrels. I know many like watching the birds but, please refrain from feeding them UNLESS you are using food that only attracts birds. There is a great product called "Mr. Bird, Flaming Hot Feast" that squirrels and rodents will **NOT** eat. It is only for birds and can be ordered from Amazon and delivered right to your home. Pet waste also attracts rats. PLEASE pick up your dog's poop!

Something Weird Is Going On...

Neighboring Development Update

As you know, the neighboring development, Glasgow is progressing. Recently, we have learned more information we want to pass along to you. The work is starting on the south side of the property, and they hope the dust will lessen as they move north. Currently, the roads are being paved and there will be three bridges. There will be a pond off of the Kimbrough entrance and a pond on Farmington. The fence design includes brick columns with a wrought iron fence. The community will not have gates but will have a guard. World renowned landscape designer, Roy Diblik, was hired. Park benches and trash cans by Victor Stanley will be used. They are the same items you see if you walk outside the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The neighborhood will illustrate quality, quality, quality! Every single aspect of this project has been well thought out and comprised of the best materials. The project concept is not your typical secluded neighborhood design. There will be a walking trail convenient for neighboring communities to walk on. The project is designed for interaction and to be inclusive with surrounding neighborhoods. Currently, there are expected to be 366 homes in the development and a waiting list of over 900 people. Tremendous resources and design time has been put into the aspects of the development and it is believed it will be great to live next door! Glasgow will be a very unique project to the area and special to Germantown. Soon, we will have an updated renderings available.
