

We, baptized members of the Church of Christ, responding in faith to the 8 call of the Holy Spirit through the Gospel, desiring to unite together

to preach the Word, administer the sacraments, develop a Christian 10

18

Name and Incorporation

- 20 The name of this congregation shall be Trinity Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Rochester, New York. 22
- For the purpose of this constitution and the accompanying bylaws, the Trinity Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Rochester, New York 24 congregation is hereinafter designated as "this congregation". 26
- This congregation shall be incorporated under the laws of the C1.11. State of New York. 28
- 30. The seal of this congregation presents the open Bible with the words "Incorporated 1975" in its inner circle and Trinity Emmanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church, Rochester, NY in its outer circle. 32
- 34 Chapter 2
- Confession of Faith 36

C2.01. This congregation confesses the Triune God, Father, Son, and 38 Holy Spirit.

- 40 This congregation confesses Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and the Gospel as the power of God for the salvation of all who believe. 42
- Jesus Christ is the Word of God incarnate, through whom everything was made and through whose life, death, and resurrection 44 God fashions a new creation. 46
- The proclamation of God's message to us as both Law and Gospel is the Word of God, revealing judgment and mercy through word and

deed, beginning with the Word in creation, continuing in the 48

history of Israel, and centering in all its fullness in the person 50 and work of Jesus Christ.

- c. The canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the written Word of God. Inspired by God's Spirit speaking through their authors, they record and announce God's revelation centering in Jesus Christ. Through them God's Spirit speaks to the testaments are the
- in Jesus Christ. Through them God's Spirit speaks to us to create and sustain Christian faith and fellowship for service in the world.
- C2.03. This congregation accepts the canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as the inspired Word of God and the authoritative source and norm of its proclamation, faith and life.
- C2.04. This congregation accepts the Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds as true declarations of the faith of this congregation.
- C2.05. This congregation accepts the Unaltered Augsburg Confession as a true witness to the Gospel, acknowledging as one with it in faith and doctrine all churches that likewise accept the teachings of the Unaltered Augsburg Confession.
- 70 C2.06. This congregation accepts the other confessional writings in the Book of Concord, namely the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Smallald Articles and the Treatise, the Small Catechism, the Large Catechism, and the Formula of Concord, as further valid interpretations of the faith of the Church.
- C2.07 This congregation confesses the gospel, recorded in the Holy Scriptures and confessed in the ecumenical creeds and Lutheran confessional writings, as the power of God to create and sustain the Church for God's mission in the world.

82 <u>Chapter 3</u>

- 84 Nature of the Church
- C3.01. All power in the Church belongs to our Lord Jesus Christ, its head. All actions of this congregation are to be carried out under his rule and authority.
- C3.02 As this congregation seeks to carry out its mission in the world, it does so under the following five functional areas:
- 92 a. Worship This congregation, remembering God's mighty acts in the past, 94 celebrating His abiding presence, and moving toward His promised fulfillment, shall listen to the Word of God in Scripture and 96 preaching, receive the sacraments, and respond with liturgical acts of confession, prayer, praise, thanksgiving, and with tithes and 98 offerings, In order to assist members to acknowledge God's rule over their lives, their own unity as Christ's body on earth, and to 00 express their relationship with God in public and in private, the congregation shall gather for worship regularly, and in accordance 02 with the traditions of the Lutheran Church recruit, equip, and

- support members for leadership in worship, use appropriate worship materials, and make certain that worship has a place in other 104 functions of the congregation. 106 Learning
- This congregation shall develop and educational ministry to assist ' 108 persons to perceive and respond to God's self-revelation in Jesus
- Christ, and, in the power of the Holy Spirit, to participate in 110
- God's continuing activity and other individuals, groups,
- institutions, culture, and the physical environment. To clarify its 112 mission the congregation shall study itself in relation to its
- community and to the church around the world. It shall provide 114
- schools and other learning activities, recruit, use appropriate
- educational materials, and make certain that adequate study 116 undergirds the other functions of the congregation.
- Witness
- This congregation, relying on the Holy Spirit, shall proclaim the 118
- Gospel by example and by programs to invite all people to repent 120
- and share the Lord's kingdom. The congregation shall motivate its
- members to witness to their faith at every opportunity in daily 122
- life. It shall try to restore those who have lapsed from active
- membership, bring new members into the fellowship of the church, 124 and recruit, equip, and support members of the congregation for
- these activities. It shall provide for the communication of the
- 126 Gospel through fellowship in the wider Christian community. It
- shall make certain that other functions witness to the faith of the 128
- d. Service
- 130 This congregation shall live by faith active in love. It shall
- motivate, equip, and support its members to visit the sick, the 132
- infirm and the imprisoned, and to minister to the poor and the
- distressed; to serve as Christians in all the institutions and
- 134 structures of society of which they are part; and individually and
- corporately to foster justice, overcome oppression, alleviate 136
- suffering and care for the earth. In these efforts the congregation
- shall cooperate with the synod and the church wide agencies of the 138
- Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, other Christian churches
- and other groups in society. It shall make certain that its other L40
- functions strengthen the motivation and ability for service.
- 142 This congregation in faithfulness to God shall provide leadership,
- organizational structures, facilities, and funds to enable .44
- fulfillment of the functions to their maximum potential. The
- congregation shall maintain effective communication among its .46 members and with its community, inculcate the motives and practices
- of stewardship in all members of the congregation, encourage 48
- generous giving to the work of the church at home and elsewhere,
- evaluate regularly the total life and ministry of the congregation 50
- and recruit, equip, and support members of the congregation to provide for these activities. 52
- C3.03 The Church exists both as a inclusive fellowship and as local 54 congregations gathered for worship and Christian service. Congregations

- find their fulfillment in the universal community of the Church, and the universal Church exists in and through congregations. This church, 156
- therefore, derives its character and powers both from the sanction and representation of its congregations and from its inherent nature as a 158 expression of the broader fellowship of the faithful. In length, it
- acknowledges itself to be in the historic continuity of the communion of 160 saints; in breadth, it expresses the fellowship of believers and 162
- congregations in our day.
- 164 Chapter 4
 - Statement of Purpose
- 166 The Church is a people created by God in Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, called and sent to bear witness to God's creative, 168
- redeeming, and sanctifying activity in the world.
- 170 C4.02 To participate in God's mission, this congregation as a part of the Church shall: 172
- Worship God in proclamation of the Word and administration of 174 the sacraments and through lives of prayer, praise, thanksgiving, witness, and service.
- 176 Proclaim God's saving Gospel of justification by grace for
- Christ's sake through faith alone, according to the apostolic 178 witness in the Holy Scripture, preserving and transmitting the Gospel faithfully to future generations.
- 180 Carry out Christ's Great Commission by reaching out to all
- people to bring them to faith in Christ and by doing all ministry 182 with a global awareness consistent with the understanding of God as Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier of all. 184
- Serve in response to God's love to meet human needs, caring for the sick and the aged, advocating dignity and justice for all
- 186 people, working for peace and reconciliation among the nations, and standing with the poor and powerless, and committing itself to 188
- their needs.
- Nurture its members in the Word of God so as to grow in faith and hope and love, to see daily life as the primary setting for the 190
- exercise of their Christian calling, and to use the gifts of the L92 Spirit for their life together and for their calling in the world.
- Manifest the unity given to the people of God by living L94 together in the love of Christ and by joining with other Christians in prayer and action to express and preserve the unity which the .96
- spirit gives.
- .98 C4.03 To fulfill these purposes, this congregation shall:
- :00 Provide services of worship at which the Word of God is preached and the sacraments are administered. 02
- b. Provide pastoral care and assist all members to participate in this ministry.
- Challenge, equip, and support all members in carrying out their calling in their daily lives and tin their congregation.
- Teach the Word of God.

- Witness to the reconciling Word of God in Christ, reaching out 208 to all people.
- Respond to human need, work for justice and peace, care for the sick and suffering, and participate responsibly in society. 210
- Motivate its members to provide financial support for the 212 congregation's ministry and the ministry of other parts of the
- Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. 214
- Foster and participate in interdependent relationships with other congregations, the synod, and the Evangelical Lutheran Church 216
- Foster and participate in ecumenical relationships consistent 218 with church wide policy.
- This congregation shall develop an organization structure to be described in the bylaws. The Congregation Council shall prepare 220
- descriptions of the responsibilities of each committee, task force, or 222 other organizational groups and shall review their actions. (Such
- Descriptions shall be contained in continuing resolutions of the 224 Congregational Council.) The Pastor shall have voice and vote in each committee or task group. The Council shall prepare descriptions of
- 226 responsibilities and review actions.
- 228 C4.05 This congregation shall, form time to time, adopt a mission
- statement which will provide specific direction for its programs. The statement of mission shall be periodically examined and evaluated with 230 the intent of possible amendment as the congregation seeks to perceive
- and respond to God's continuing call in the midst of changing conditions 232 234

236 Chapter 5

- 238 Powers of the Congregation
- C5.01. The powers of the congregation are those necessary to fulfill 240 its purpose.
- 242 C5.02. The powers of this congregation are vested in the Congregation Meeting called and conducted as provided in this constitution and 244
- 246 C5.03. Only such authority as is delegated to the Congregation Council or other organizational units in the congregation's governing
- 248 documents is recognized. All remaining authority is retained by the congregation. The congregation is authorized to: !50
 - a. call a pastor;
- !52 appoint or terminate the appointment of associates in ministry b. in conformity with the applicable policy of the Evangelical 54
- Lutheran Church in America;
 - approve the annual budget;
- 56 acquire real and personal property by gift, devise, purchase, d. or other lawful means; 3

- hold title to and use its property for any and all activities 258 consistent with its purpose;
- 260 sell, mortgage, lease, transfer, or otherwise dispose of its property by any lawful means;
- 262 elect its Congregation Council and require them to carry out their duties in accordance with the constitution, bylaws, and 264 continuing resolutions; and
- terminate its relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran 266 Church in America as provided in Chapter 6.

Chapter 6 270

268

Church Affiliation

- 272 This congregation shall be an interdependent part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or its successor, and of the
- Upstate New York Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. 274 This Congregation is a subject to the discipline of the Evangelical
- 276 Lutheran Church in America.
- 278 This congregation accepts the Confession of the Faith and agrees to the Purpose of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and shall act in accordance with them. 280
- 282 C6. 03 This congregation acknowledges its relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in which: 284
- This congregation agrees to be responsible for its life as a a. 286 Christian community.
- This congregation pledges its financial support and 288 participation in the life and mission of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. 290
- This congregation agrees to call pastoral leadership from the clergy roster of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in 292 accordance with its call procedures except in special circumstances and with the approval of the bishop of the synod. 294
- This congregation agrees to consider associates in ministry for appointment to other staff positions in the congregation 296 according to the procedures of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- 298 This congregation agrees to file this constitution and any subsequent changes to this constitution with the synod for review 300 to ascertain that all of its provisions are in agreement with the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in
- 302 America or with the constitution of the synod.
- The Bishop of the synod or an appointed representative shall 304 have the right to be present at and shall receive prior notice of, all meetings of the congregation and of the church council during a 306 pastoral vacancy.
- 308 'Affiliation with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America may be terminated as follows:

- 310
- This congregation takes action to dissolve. a.
- 312 This congregation ceases to exist. b.
- This congregation is removed from membership in the c. 314
- Evangelical Lutheran Church in America according to the procedures for discipline of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- 316 This congregation follows the procedures outlined in C6.05.
- 318 C6.05. This congregation may terminate its relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America by the following procedure: 320
- A resolution indicating the desire of this congregation to terminate its relationship must be adopted at a legally called and 322 conducted special meeting of this congregation by a two-thirds majority of the voting members present. 324
- The secretary of this congregation shall submit a copy of the resolution to the synodical bishop and shall mail a copy of the 326 resolution to voting members of the congregation. This notice shall
- be submitted within 10 days after the resolution has been adopted. 328
- The bishop of the synod shall consult with this congregation 330: during a period of at least 90 days.
- If this congregation , after consultation, still desires to 332 terminate its relationship, such action may be taken at a legally called and conducted special meeting by a two-thirds majority of
- 334 the voting members present, at which meeting the bishop of the synod or a authorized representative shall be present. Notice of
- the meeting shall be mailed to all voting members at least 10 days 336 in advance of the meeting. 338
- A certified copy of the resolution to terminate its relationship shall be sent to the synodical bishop, at which time 340 the relationship between this congregation and ELCA shall be terminated.
- 342 Notice of termination shall be forwarded by the synodical bishop to the secretary of this church and published in the 344 periodical of this church.
- If this congregation was a member of the Lutheran Church in 346 America it shall be required, in addition to the provision in C6.05., to receive synodical approval before terminating its 348 membership in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- 350 If this congregation is considering relocation, it shall confer with the bishop of the synod before any steps are taken leading to such action. The approval of the Synod Council shall be received 352 before any such action is effected. 354

Chapter 7 356

Property Ownership

358 If this congregation ceases to exist, title to undisposed property shall pass to the Upstate New York Synod of the Evangelical 360 Lutheran Church in America.

- If this congregation is removed from membership in the 362 Evangelical Lutheran Church in America according to its procedure for
- discipline, title of property shall continue to reside in this 364 congregation.
- 366
- If a two-thirds majority of the voting members of this congregation present at a regularly called and conducted special meeting 368 of this congregation vote to transfer to another Lutheran church body,
- title to property shall continue to reside in this congregation. Before 370 this congregation takes action to transfer to another Lutheran church
- body, it shall consult with representatives of the Upstate New York 372 Synod.
- 374
- If a two-thirds majority of the voting members of this C7.04. congregation present at a regularly called and conducted special meeting 376 of this congregation vote to become independent or relate to a non-
- Lutheran church body, title to the property of this congregation shall 378 continue to reside in this congregation only with the consent of the
- 380 Synod Council, The Synod Council, after consultation with the congregation by the established synodical process, may give approval to
- the request to become independent or to relate to a non-Lutheran church 382 body, in which case title shall remain with the majority of the
- congregation. I the Synod Council fails to give such approval, title 384 shall remain with those members who desire to continue as a congregation
- of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. 386

Chapter 8

Membership

- 392 Members of this congregation shall be those baptized persons on the roll of the congregation a the time that this constitution is
- adopted and those who are admitted thereafter and who have declared and 394 maintain their membership in accordance with the provision of this
- 396 constitution and its bylaws.
- 398 C8.02. Members shall be classified as follows:
- 400 Baptized members are those persons who have been received by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in this congregation, or, having been 402 previously baptized in the name of the Triune God, have received by certificate of transfer from other Lutheran congregations or by
- 404 affirmation of faith.
- Confirmed members are baptized persons who have been confirmed 406 in this congregation, those who have received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members form other Lutheran congregations,
- 408 or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.
- Voting members are confirmed members who have attained the age 410 of sixteen years. Such confirmed members shall have communed and
- made a contribution of record during the current or preceding 412 year.

- d. Associate members are persons holding membership in other 414 Lutheran (Christian) congregations who wish to retain such
- membership but desire to participate in the life and mission this 416 congregation. They have all the privileges and duties of membership
- except voting rights and eligibility for elected offices or 418 membership on the Congregation Council of this congregation.
- 420 All applications for confirmed membership shall be submitted to and shall require the approval of the Congregation Council. 422
- It shall be the privilege and duty of members of this 424 congregation to:
- 426 make regular use of the means of grace, both Word and Sacraments: 428
- live a Christian life in accordance with the Word of God and the teachings of the Lutheran church; and
- 430 support the work of this congregation and of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America through contributions of their time, 432 abilities, and financial support as biblical stewards.
- 434 C8.05. Membership in this congregation shall be terminated by any of the following: 436 a. death:
 - - b. resignation;
- 438 transfer of release; C.
- disciplinary action by the Congregation Council; or đ.
- 440 removal from the roll due to inactivity as defined in the bylaws. 442
- such persons who have been removed from the roll of members shall remain persons for whom the church has a continuing pastoral concern. 444
- 446 C8.06. Responsibilities of the congregation for fostering faithful membership shall include: 448
- proper instruction in the Word of God and the teaching of the 450 Lutheran Church prior to reception as confirmed members.
- b. transfer membership to another Lutheran congregation or the 452 issuing of a certificate of standing and/or release to another
- evangelical congregation at the request of the confirmed member: 454
- (such transfer of membership or issuing of a certificate of 456
- standing and/or release would be granted to baptized but unconfirmed children at the request of their parents).
- encouraging members who move from the community which the 458 congregation serves to transfer to a Lutheran congregation which
- can serve them effectively and in which they can participate 460 regularly. A Lutheran congregation in the new community which such members live shall be notified of their move. 462
- continuing concern and conscientious pastoral care for members, in an effort to encourage fulfillment of their duties and . 164 responsibilities, when they do not partake of Holy Communion,

support the church with their offerings, or appear to desire to participate in the life and worship of the congregation. When such 466 members have failed to receive Holy Communion and to make a contribution of record for a period of two consecutive calendar 468 years, they may be removed form the roll of members by the Church Council. This procedure will take place only when there is a pastor 470 under call to serve this congregation or with the approval of the bishop of the synod and after such members have been counseled 472 about the matter, if possible. Such persons who have been removed 474 from the roll of members shall remain person for whom the church has a continuing pastoral concern.

478 Chapter 9

480 The Pastor

- C9.01. Authority to call a pastor shall be in this congregation by at least a two-thirds majority ballot vote of members present and voting at a meeting regularly called for that purpose. Before a call is issued,
- the officers, or a committee elected by this congregation to recommend the call, shall seek the advise and help of the bishop of the synod.

C9.02. Only a member o the clergy roster of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or who has been recommended for it by the synodical bishop may be called as a pastor of this congregation.

490 C9.03. Consistent with the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America:

- a. every ordained minister shall:
 - 1) preach the Word;
 - 2) administer the sacraments;
 - 3) conduct public worship;
 - 4) provide pastoral care; and
- 5) speak publicly to the world in solidarity with the poor and oppressed, calling for justice and proclaiming God's love for the world.
 - b. Each ordained minister with a congregational call shall, within the congregation:
 - 1) offer instruction, confirm, marry, visit the sick and distressed, and bury the dead;
 - 2) supervise all schools and organizations of the congregation;
 - 3) shall install regularly elected members of the Congregation Council; and
 - 4) with the council administer discipline.
- 510 c. Every pastor shall:
- 1) seek out and encourage qualified persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel; and strive to extend the Kingdom of god in the community, in the nation, and abroad;
 - 2) impart knowledge of this church and its wider ministry through distribution of its periodicals and other publications; and

3) endeavor to increase the support given by the congregation 518 to the work of the ELCA church wide organization and of this 520

The specific duties of the pastor, compensations, and other matters pertaining to the service of the pastor shall be included in the 522 524

C9.05.

- The call of a congregation, when accepted by a pastor, shall a. constitute a continuing mutual relationship and commitment which, except in the case of the death of the pastor, shall be terminated only following consultation with the synodical bishop and for the
 - 1) mutual agreement to terminate the call or the completion of a call for a specific term of years;

2) resignation of the pastor;

- 3) inability to conduct the pastoral office effectively in the congregation in view of local conditions, without reflection n the competence or the moral and spiritual character of the pastor;
- 4) the physical of mental incapacity of the pastor;
- 5) disqualification of the pastor through discipline on grounds of doctrine, morality, or continued neglect of duty;
- 6) dissolution of the congregation.
- In the case of alleged physical or mental incapacity of the 544 pastor or ineffective conduct of the pastoral office, it shall be the responsibility of the bishop of the synod, when such 546 difficulties are personally known or have been brought to the synod's attention by an official recital of allegations by the Congregation Council, or by a petition signed by a least one-third 548 of the voting members of the congregation, to investigate such 550 conditions personally in company with committee of two ordained ministers and one lay person. 552
- In case of alleged physical or mental incapacity competent medical testimony shall be obtained. When such disability is 554 evident, the bishop of the synod with the advice of the committee shall declare the pastorate vacant. Upon the restoration of a 556 disabled pastor to health, the bishop of the synod shall take steps to enable the pastor to resume the ministry, either in the 558 congregation last served or in a another field of labor. 160
 - In the case of alleged local difficulties which imperil the effective functioning of the congregation, all concerned persons shall be heard, after which the bishop of the synod together with the committee described in C9.05.b. shall decide on the course of action to be recommended to the pastor and the congregation. If they agree to carry out such recommendations, no further action shall be taken by the synod. If either party fails to assent, the matter shall be referred to the Synod Council for its hearing and decision. The decision of the Synod Council shall be final.

- The foregoing procedure shall never be invoked when questions 568 of doctrine, morality, or continued neglect of duty are involved,
- all such cases being treated as disciplinary matters. 570
- If in the course of the proceedings, it should become apparent that the pastoral office cannot be conducted effectively in the 572
- congregation being served by the ordained minister due to local conditions, the bishop of the synod may temporarily suspend the 574
- pastor from services in the congregation without prejudice and 576
- with pay provided through a join church wide/synod fund and with housing provided by the congregation.
- In order that a pastor of this congregation may be devoted 578 fully to the duties of the office, an adequate salary shall be
- provided, paid in semi-monthly or monthly installments. Expenses 580 incident to attendance at conventions of the synod, except for
- travel, and attendance at meetings of the conference shall be 582 defrayed by the congregation. 584
- At a time of pastoral vacancy, an interim pastor may be appointed by the bishop of the synod with the consent of this 586 congregation or the Congregational Council. 588
- C9.07. During the period of service, an interim pastor shall have the rights and duties of a regularly called pastor and may delegate the same 590 in part to a supply pastor with the consent of the bishop of the synod 592
- and this congregation or Congregation Council. The interim pastor and any ordained pastor providing assistance shall refrain from exerting
- influence in the selection of a pastor. 594
- 596 This congregation shall make satisfactory settlement of all financial obligations to a former pastor before calling a successor. A pastor shall make satisfactory settlement of all financial obligations 598
- to this congregation. 600
- When a pastor is called to serve in company with another pastor or pastors, the privileges and responsibilities of each pastor 602 shall be specified in documents to accompany the call and to be drafted
- in consultation involving the pastors, the congregation council, and the 604 bishop of the synod. As occasion requires, the documents may be revised
- 606 through a similar consultation.
- 608 With the approval of the bishop of synod the congregation may depart from C9.05.a. and call a pastor fro a specific term of years.
- 610 Details of such calls shall be in writing setting forth the purpose and conditions involved. Prior to the completion of a term, the bishop or a
- 612 designated representative of the bishop, shall meet with the pastor and representative of the congregation for a review of the call. Such call
- 614 may also be terminated before its expiration in accordance with the provisions of C9.05.a. 616
- C9.12. The pastor shall keep accurate parochial records of all baptisms, confirmations, marriages, burials, communicants, members 518

- received, members dismissed, or members excluded form the congregation, and shall submit a summary of such statistics annually to the synod. 620
- C9.13. The pastor(s) shall submit a report of his or her ministry to 622 the bishop of synod at least 90 days prior to each regular meeting of 624 626

Chapter 10

628 Congregation Meeting

- The Congregation shall meet semi-annually at a time specified 630 in the bylaws. 632
