

INT. PRISON NIGHT

A Prisoner can be seen in his cell pacing. The camera is located in one corner of the cell and there is a filter that makes it look like a surveillance camera.

INT. CELL NIGHT

The camera is now in the cell with the prisoner and a Corrections Officer can be seen walking past the glass in the door to the cell.

PRISONER

Excuse me! Sir excuse me.

The Corrections Officer (CO) returns to the window.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER (CO)

What do you want inmate?

PRISONER

Can you tell me why I'm here. What have I done?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

I haven't seen your paperwork yet, but I hear this all the time. Why do you think you are here?

PRISONER

I tried to seek asylum in the Czech Republic and got locked in a mental hospital. I got back here to the U.S. and started researching a friend of mine's company and it's been a nightmare ever since. I keep ending up in these places and nobody will connect the dots.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Inmate what are you trying to say? I have to finish my rounds.

PRISONER

Do you realize that the Pharmaceutical Industry spends the largest amount of money on lobbying in Washington than any other industry?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

I didn't know that. I'm going to

finish my rounds.

PRISONER

Wait, sir, will you please come back and hear me out.

The CO walks out of sight.

INT. CELL SAME NIGHT

We're back in the surveillance camera and it shows a time lapse of the Prisoner pacing, doing pushups, sit-ups, sitting on the bed.

INT. CELL SAME NIGHT

The CO walks back in front of the glass window.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Inmate I looked you up. Computer says you're mentally ill.

PRISONER

That's interesting. CO would you mind if I ask you some questions, just to get an opinion.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Sure, I've had some interesting conversations on the night shift and most of the inmates have never left the country.

PRISONER

It would be helpful if you could pretend you are an executive at a large pharmaceutical company that is highly diversified in producing consumer goods, lets say for grooming, as well as medical devices and hospital equipment.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

I'll do my best.

PRISONER

Ok so you are aware that there is a factory farm style meat industry that cages animals up to their knees in feces and feeds them leftover pieces of their own species that is loaded with antibiotics to add mass to their bodies?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
I'm aware.

PRISONER
What you may not be aware of is a study done by a university that issued zero antibiotics to a population of pigs. Instead they separated the pigs at different stages of development and put them into different pen structures based on their age. Do you know what was proven by this study?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
I do not.

PRISONER
The agricultural scientists found that the pigs in the study without antibiotics or hormones put on weight more quickly than the population given antibiotics in the feed to boost their mass.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
That is interesting.

PRISONER
Right, but remember you are the executive and your company makes medicine, some of which are antibiotics that get sold to the agricultural industry.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
Ok

PRISONER
Are you more likely to share the study or bury it? Are you more likely to help farmers adapt their farms to this system or support factory farms owned by corporations and traded on the market? Are you more likely to support a company like Monsanto that owns a patent on DNA or a grassroots group like PETA?
Who in your eye is more deserving of the label "radical", the mad scientists at Monsanto practicing gene splicing or college kids from

PETA who pay off an immigrant to take a camera into a factory farm and expose the horrors within?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
Those are difficult questions.

PRISONER
Have you ever wondered how many pharmaceuticals are sold to the prison industry?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
That's enough for tonight inmate.

The CO walks out of the window.

INT. CELL NIGHT 2

The surveillance camera shows the Prisoner in time lapse doing exercises and pacing.

INT. CELL NIGHT 2

The CO walks into the window.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
What's the discussion tonight?

PRISONER
Gauze.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
Gauze? Like gauze pads?

PRISONER
Correct, kinda like what the women in the female prison struggle to get. Anyway you are the Pharma executive again.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
Okay.....

PRISONER
The public may not make the quality of their food a priority but what entity is always equipped with plenty of gauze?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
A hospital?

PRISONER

The Military. Imagine you got your executive job because you were the inventor of the Band Aid. Your first big contract was to put a medical kit in every rucksack and piece of machinery in every branch of the military.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

That's a trademark for a company....

PRISONER

That's right you remember, because you hired the best marketing agency to make a commercial with kids singing a cute little song and other commercials of newborn babies and soft lighting to promote your baby powder so that the American public just thinks of your company as a wholesome family corporation, never capable of a misdeed.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

I think I see where you are going with this.

PRISONER

Good, because now your company is international as the world embraces "globalism". Your corporation is now a world power and you can supply as many militaries as the SEC allows, if they are even paying attention. So what is your motivation to end war and bring peace to the planet? Don't you want your gauze sales to meet your quarterly projections?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

You are making a valid point.

PRISONER

Maybe our next ad campaign should show real military personnel with real injuries smiling at the camera and singing I am stuck on Band Aid brand cuz Band Aid's stuck on me? (Laughs) but the Pentagon won't ok that type of thing with all your lobby money floating around Washington, only radicals like PETA

would do something like that.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

To talk to you, you don't seem that ill.

PRISONER

Maybe I'm not. I've always thought that I make too much sense, so its easier to put that label on me. The problem is I can only talk to one person at a time. I could spend my whole life convincing several thousand people one conversation at a time of the vileness of a company. Then the company would come out with a new ad campaign that makes them seem like a wholesome, honest, American family company.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Maybe you are just high functioning.

PRISONER

Thanks, I love it when doctors force me on medication then say I'm high functioning like its a compliment. I have one last scenario as an executive, are you game?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

I'll stay a bit longer if you like.

PRISONER

So you've worked your way up through the company for the past 35 years living the executive lifestyle.

You remember the car phone that needed a car battery to make a mobile phone call and watched from your car over the years as more and more communication towers went up. Exponentially more towers dot the horizon with their flashing red lights than when you were a child and now there are even signal amplification devices on buildings so that you can fit a telephone slash computer in your pocket.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

I would agree with that.

PRISONER

You remember when you could run a large multinational corporate conglomerate with just typewriters and LAN line telephones, but now even when you turn C-span on the television, there is a Senate Committee with members of Congress talking about how the economy needs the next new powerful network for mobile devices and the government needs to invest in the infrastructure for it. But you also have access to the sales figures for all the various pills your company sells. Over the past 35 years instances of Attention Deficit Disorder have increased, also autism is on the rise, mental illness and depression are growing in percentage of the population, even executives like yourself are experiencing sleeplessness and sleeping disorders.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

There's a pill for that.

PRISONER

That's right and you make it. It took over a hundred years for the American public to make a connection between lung cancer and smoking. Factory farms have been around since the 1950's but our pig study just came out in the past 10 years.

Your cruising towards retirement and pill sales are climbing so how likely are you to support studies drawing connections between mental illness and wireless communication waves? How likely are you to fight within your company to support those studies. If you knew someone personally afflicted by a disorder, how likely are you to support his projects to raise awareness?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Probably not too likely because I'm

relying on my stock options to get me through retirement in the lifestyle I enjoy.

PRISONER

Let me put it this way. I saw an interview with Noam Chomsky at his office in Stanford. He said look around this campus and you'll see buildings named after pharmaceutical companies. The government pays for universities to do the studies and then the pharmaceutical companies benefit from the results. But I haven't even gotten into my proof of a corporation defrauding the government.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

I want to hear it but it will have to be tomorrow, hopefully you aren't transferred before then.

PRISONER

Where are they taking me?

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

You know I can't tell you.

The CO walks out of the window.

INT. CELL NIGHT 3

Surveillance Camera shows Prisoner pacing, exercising, etc.

INT. CELL NIGHT 3

The CO walks up to the window.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

I can't find any charges in your file, what happened in the Czech Republic?

PRISONER

When they first took me in these orderlies strapped me to the bed and injected me with something. I woke up a day later and found only one arm strapped. I released that arm so I could piss in the jug they left in the room I was locked in. I went back to the bed I was in and

the strap down device was made of canvas that spread across the mattress. On either side was a cuff with a buckle to hold the wrists. On the cuffs were a small metal moveable part that worked to pinch the wrists. The part that touched the wrist was polished metal that fanned from a shaft into about a one inch circle. The part of the shaft that protruded through the top of the cuff was capped with a black plastic cylinder. Pressed into the plastic of this cap was a U.S. Patent # . I thought that the library should offer me a layer of protection, since the FBI is the only federal agency with a program to monitor people's library use.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

So what did you find?

PRISONER

The patent number brings up a novel bleaching method in the U.S. Patent Database. It's the kind of chemical process you would need to clean the blood off of the canvas that our special medical strap down device is partially made of. Furthermore, the international patent office registered no results.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

What did you do next?

PRISONER

Through watching C-span I learned that the Homeland Security Department is in charge of cyber security for all .gov Websites in the United States. The Patent office is a .gov Site and knowing the tendencies of intelligence agencies I got the patent number tattooed on my finger, see this is the number.

Prisoner shows the guard his left ring finger with the U.S. Patent number written on it.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Why did you get the tattoo?

PRISONER

Because I know this is the right number on that device. That means one of three things, Homeland isn't doing its job of protecting the online patent database, Johnson & Johnson is defrauding the Federal government by manipulating one of its company's patent numbers, or both Johnson & Johnson and Homeland are in collusion together. If the last option is true, it means that Homeland can monitor the internet for any of these strap down devices coming back into the U.S. and pull the patented parts off of them to cover their own ass.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Doesn't this sound delusional to you.

PRISONER

I went back to the library to look up the name of the company embroidered on the device. It is a small company based in Canada with 8 employees. CORRECTIONS OFFICER

This is a pretty scary conspiracy, so you are saying people are being strapped down and murdered?

PRISONER

It's more likely they are being strapped down and raped or having drugs tested on them, but in places like Gitmo murder is probably not unlikely.

Here is the most amazing part of it all, the Canadian company with only a few employees makes stirrup devices for Gynecologist offices as well. So the handful of executives with the pass through company making strap down devices also make devices for one of if not the only medical fields dominated by females. This means millions of legitimate female doctors are ordering equipment from a fraudulent company and when the shit hits the fan, women will be to blame.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Only a man could come up with something as twisted as this.

PRISONER

This is why I tried to talk to females at the FBI and when they

didn't get back to me I tried to contact female politicians in the EU. To warn them.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

This is a lot to take in, listen, I get bullshitters in here all the time telling me lies. How could they hide a whole means of production like that?

PRISONER

We are talking about pharmaceutical companies that get a patent on a drug and set the price of the drug one thousand percent over what it costs them to make it. You can't have these exorbitant profit margins on patented drugs unless you had multiple ways of producing products, and nobody giving away the secret recipe. This even applies to medical restraint device designs.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Don't you think that government investigators have some kind of handle on this?

PRISONER

Do you really think our government investigators get a lot of cooperation when a private company can build some schools in a country while their government looks the other way as they build a pill factory on a remote mountainside? Just think what they'll do with robotics. Automated plants so that there is zero risk of a human stealing a pill and taking it to another company to analyze the formula.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER

These are lies and delusions. As I said I get mentally ill types like you in here telling stories on the regular.

PRISONER

What if they aren't lying, I'm not, (beat) what if you're the CO that

always gets stuck with the ones
with the proof.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
Inmate, they are lying! I can't
work at a place like this and live
with myself if they're not. You
need treatment.

CO walks away from the window.

PRISONER
DO NOT WALK AWAY FROM ME!

INT. CELL DAY

Surveillance Camera shows Prisoner exercising, etc. In time
lapse.

INT. CELL DAY

CO walks up to the window.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
They've come to transfer you to
another facility, Son.

PRISONER
Please don't let them test more
drugs on me.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
Son, I've done all I can, you're
mentally ill, you need medication.

PRISONER
When you say that I feel like the
glass was just too thick for me to
get through.

CORRECTIONS OFFICER
I love you, son.

PRISONER
I love you as well, dad.
