It would be a place where beautiful gardens are tended and individual monuments celebrate life and death. And so it continues to be.


Seventy-five thousand people are buried here, with space for twenty thousand more. Beneath our ancient elms, oaks and magnolias lie our most honored and revered. Flowering dogwoods and crepe myrtles are interspersed with Memphis history, those famous and infamous, loved and feared. There are veterans of every American war, from the Revolutionary War forward. There are people from every walk of life and every culture. Generals, senators and governors, mayors, madams and murderers and, of course, perfectly ordinary citizens. Elmwood is a place for all people. It is Memphis history.

Visit the Carpenter Gothic Cottage, built in 1866 and topped by a bell that tolls for each service as it has since 1870. Stroll through our 80 acres and marvel at stunning—and sometimes a little bit strange—statuaries. Stop by the Chapel at Elmwood where funeral services, weddings and more take place. Relax in the

shade of the arboretum. Or just sit by the columbarium and enjoy a peaceful moment. The residents of Elmwood are happy to share.
