I am incredibly thankful for serving you on the National Membership Team, especially after such a successful 2023 competition. If your chapter is not providing any incentives, it is crucial to address this issue during your next board meeting. We are seeing more and more that associate members are the future of UPMA, and with dues at \$2.65 per pay period, we can connect them with selecting officials and opportunities that they would otherwise miss out on. You can be a huge part in helping to create a USPS future we can be proud of by ensuring that high-performing associates are noticed by selecting officials.

A common objective for chapter board members is to recruit two new members every month. One effective way to achieve this is by consulting with your Manager of Employee Development for access to new employee orientation, NSP, PME, and Career Conferences. Additionally, keep an eye out for in-person trainings and actively reach out to nonmembers. Your UPMA Chapter Membership Chairperson can provide you with a list of pre-member offices to contact Postmasters. You can also request a list of Supervisor Interns/204bs in your area from your MPOO.

Recruitment is not solely about the numbers. While it is gratifying to be recognized as an outstanding recruiter, our goal is to invite like-minded individuals to join us in understanding and advocating for the limited rights we have as EAS employees. We provide daily opportunities for advancement and offer high-performing individuals a chance to serve at the chapter level.

National UPMA members gathered in Denver, CO for the 7th Annual convention in 2023. Postmaster General (PMG) Louis DeJoy attended and spoke of the Delivering for America (DFA) Plan to the near 1,000 attendees. DFA is helping the USPS move into a promising future. DFA was implemented in 2021 with the purpose of seeing the business model grow into a more successful operational, service and financially stable business. When everyone is on board, he said, "we will be a high-performing organization that has a vibrant future."

Indiana Chapter President Jeff Jarrett took the floor during a Q&A with Douglas Tulino - Deputy Postmaster General and Chief Human Resource Officer for USPS. Jarrett asked, in part, "What efforts are being made to ensure competitive and fair compensation packages for Postmasters to attract and retain top talent in the United States Postal Service?" DPMG Tulino responded that moving forward they hope to continue with competitive packages and he has been in talks with PMG DeJoy. DPMG Tulino highlighted the recent 3% increase.

Family members are encouraged to attend but must pay their own meal expenses.

It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure the application is delivered by March 1, 2024. Applications received after March 1st will not be considered.
