Focus: To represent. To speak for.

"As ambassadors of Christ, we must skillfully navigate and maneuver within different spaces while maintaining firm boundaries."

"Integrity is a cornerstone of our witness. Our actions should align with and affirm the truth of God's Word—not just for others to see, but because we truly believe it."



Scripture: 2 Corinthians 5: 16 - 21 NLT

“So we have stopped evaluating others from a human point of view. At one time we thought of Christ merely from a human point of view. How differently we know him now! This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun! And all of this is a gift from God, who brought us back to himself through Christ. And God has given us this task of reconciling people to him.

For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, no longer counting people’s sins against them. And he gave us this wonderful message of reconciliation.

So we are Christ’s ambassadors; God is making his appeal through us. We speak for Christ when we plead, “Come back to God!” For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ.”



What is ambassadorship?

Ambassadorship is a demonstration of God's love lived out with integrity—evidenced through **kindness, gentleness, patience, and humility.**



Story Time

Each of the following stories highlights love expressed through integrity in different ways—standing firm in faith, forgiving, being patient, and responding to hardship with grace.



Daniel's Integrity in Babylon (Daniel 6)

Daniel was a faithful servant of God, living as an ambassador in a foreign land. When a law was passed that forbade prayer to anyone but the king, Daniel remained steadfast in his devotion to God. Despite the risk of being thrown into the lion's den, he continued to pray openly. God protected him, and his integrity became a witness to King Darius, who ultimately acknowledged God's power.

Reflection Question: How does your commitment to integrity impact those around you, even in difficult circumstances?



Joseph's Kindness and Forgiveness (Genesis 45:4-8)

Joseph, once betrayed by his brothers and sold into slavery, rose to power in Egypt. When his brothers came seeking food during a famine, he had the power to take revenge. Instead, he responded with kindness and forgiveness, seeing God's greater purpose in his suffering. He reassured them, saying, "Do not be distressed... God sent me ahead of you to preserve life."

Reflection Question: How can you show kindness and humility to those who have wronged you?



Jesus' Patience with Peter (John 21:15-17)

After Peter denied Jesus three times, he was filled with guilt. But after His resurrection, Jesus did not condemn Peter. Instead, He gently restored him by asking three times, “Do you love me?” and commissioning him to shepherd His people. Jesus showed patience, giving Peter another chance to live out his calling.

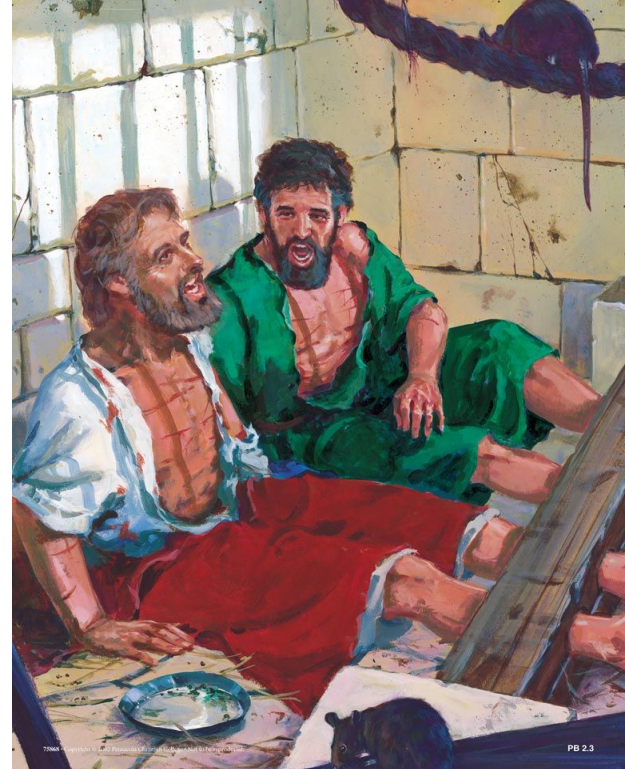
Reflection Question: How can you practice patience in restoring relationships or helping others grow?



Paul and Silas Gentle Response in Praise (Act 16:25-34)

Paul and Silas were beaten and imprisoned for preaching the gospel. Instead of responding with anger, they prayed and sang hymns. When an earthquake set them free, they did not escape, showing integrity and concern for the jailer. Their actions led the jailer and his household to faith in Christ.

Reflection Question: How can your response to hardship demonstrate God's love to others?
